Device Overview

Open View



	Keys	Description
1	Earpiece	To hear the caller and automated prompts
2	Left Soft Key	To access Notifications
3	Call Key	To make a call
4	Numeric Pad	From the home screen pressing numeric keys allows access to default shortcuts. Keys will also allow entering phone numbers and alphabetical text.
5	Navigation Key (Up, Down, Left, Right)	Press Up - Access Ringtones & Alerts • Press Right - Access Calendar • Press Down - Access Clock • Press Left - Access Calculator
6	Right Soft Key	To access Contacts
7	End/Power Key	To power ON/OFF the device. • To restart. • To end a call.
8	OK Key	To access the application list. • To confirm an option.
9	Volume Key	To increase and decrease the volume.
10	Vibration Mode Key	To set the Vibrate mode from standby mode. Press and hold the button for about 3 seconds to change to the Vibrate mode.
11	Microphone	To transmit your voice to the caller or for voice-activated functions (for example, voice commands).

	Keys	Description
1	Volume button	To adjust volume
2	Camera Button	To open the Camera. When the device is closed and the screen is on, short press the Camera Button twice to turn on/off the camera.
3	Headset Jack	Allows you to plug in an optional 3.5mm headset for convenient, hands-free conversations or other compatible listening devices.
4	Type-C USB/ Charging Port	To charge the device.


Front & Back View



	Description	Description
1	Camera	To take photos
2	Flash	Lights up subjects in low-light environments when taking pictures or recording video.
3	External Display	To display notifications and messages.
4	Back Cover	To protect the internal components of your device.
5	Speaker	To hear sounds from your phone and media content (for example, music and ringtones).

Installing Battery

 With the phone facing down, insert your fingernail into the cutout on the bottom of the back cover and gently lift the cover.



2. Place the battery, making sure the gold contacts are lined up.



- 3. Push in and press down gently to secure.
- 4. Place the back cover and press it down along the edges to close.

Charging the Battery

The battery comes partially charged. You must fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time.

Warning! Use only approved charging devices and batteries. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.



Your device comes with a charger (charging head and USB cable) to charge from any electrical outlet.

- 1. Insert the smaller head of the USB cable into the device port.
- Connect the larger head of the USB cable to the charging head, then plug the charging head into a standard electrical outlet.
- 3. When charging is complete, unplug the charging head from the power outlet and remove the USB cable from the device.

Tip to extend and improve your device battery life

Conserve battery power to get the best out of your battery in everyday usage by following settings on select applications:

- Lower Screen brightness.
- Reduce Backlight time.
- · Turn Bluetooth off when not in use.
- Enable the battery saver feature.

Replacing the nano SIM Card

Your device comes with a pre-installed nano SIM card.

To replace the nano SIM Card

- Turn OFF the phone, then remove the back cover and battery.
- Locate the slot for the SIM card and gently slide the SIM card tray down to unlock the tray.
- 3. The SIM is now accessible by opening the tray.

Inserting a microSD Card

- Remove the back cover as demonstrated in the previous instructions.
- Position the microSD card with the label side facing up and the gold contacts toward the slot (at the lower-right side of the phone).
- 3. Carefully slide the SD tray to the right to unlock it, place the microSD card, and lock the tray by sliding left.

NOTE:

- The microSD cards can be damaged easily by improper operation. Be careful when inserting, removing, or handling it.
- The device can support up to a 128GB microSD card.

 To remove the microSD card, follow similar steps from the Removing the <u>Battery section</u>.

Turning Your Phone ON

Press and hold the **End/Power Key** a until the phone powers ON.

The first time you power ON the phone, you will be guided through the following steps:

- Select the phone's language and press the Right Soft Key
 to go to the next step.
- Select and set Accessibility options and press the Right Soft Key to go to the next step.
- Use the Navigation Key □ and the OK Key to set options, then press the Right Soft Key □ to go to the next step.
- Read and press the Right Soft Key to go to the next step.
- Finally press the **OK Key** to enter the Home screen.

NOTE: Even if no SIM card is installed, your phone will still power on and use some of the phone's features.

Turning Your Phone OFF

Press and hold the **End/Power Key** until the phone displays:

- Restart and Power OFF.
- Use the Navigation Key to select power OFF and press the OK Key.

Home Screen

The Home screen serves as the start of your experience.



You can customize your Home screen wallpaper and clock format using the **Settings** ② app.

From the status bar, you can view both phone status (to the right side) and notification information (to the left side)

Status Bar

The Status Bar appears at the top of every screen. Time is displayed on the left side of the status bar. The phone's status icon appears on the right.

Notifications

Notification icons on the Status Bar display calendar events, device status, and much more. The status bar will display the notification icon when you receive a notification.

The **Notifications view** shows a list of all your recent notifications. Depending on your settings, you may hear a sound, see the light, or feel the phone vibrate.

To Open the Notification View

- From the Home screen, press the Left Soft Key
 to open the Notification view.
- A list of all your current notifications appears in the Notifications view, organized by ongoing and event-based notifications.

To Respond to a Notification

The Notifications view allows you to view all your current notifications with a brief description.

- Press the **OK Key** to open and view the details of the highlighted notification.
- Press the Left Soft Key to clear the highlighted notification.
- Press the Right Soft Key to clear all notifications or access options for a highlighted notification.

Explore Phone

Quick Volume Adjustments

The Volume key on the phone's right side is used to adjust the ringer and earpiece volume quickly.

- The Volume up key increases the volume.
- The Volume down key decreases the volume.

Vibrate Mode

It turns OFF ringing and sets the phone to vibration.

 From the Home screen, press and hold the Vibrate key which sets the phone to Vibrate Mode.

Write Text

Enter text using the numeric keypad.

- Press a key repeatedly until the letter is shown.
- To enter space, press 0.
- To enter a special character or a punctuation mark, press *.
- To switch between character cases, press # repeatedly.
- To enter a number, press and hold a number key.

Capturing a Screenshot

 Press and hold the * and # keys simultaneously to capture a screenshot of the desired screen. Screenshots are saved directly to the Gallery.

Contacts

The Contacts app allows you to store and manage a contact list with names and phone numbers.

From the Home screen, press the OK Key ■ and select
 Contacts
 To enter the contacts list.

Adding a New Contact

- Press the Left Soft Key on the Contacts list screen to create a New contact.
- 2. Input the contact information.
- 3. Press the **OK Key** to **SAVE** the contact information.

View a Contact

- On the contacts list screen, use the Navigation Key □ to select a contact, and press the OK Key ■ to access the contact details.
- Press the Left Soft Key to send an SMS/MMS to the selected contact.
- 3. Press the **OK Key** to place a **CALL**.
- 4. Press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options**.
 - Press Add as Favorite to add a contact as a favorite number.
 - Press Edit to modify a contact detail.
 - Press Speed Dial to set up a speed dial contact.
 - Press Share to share a contact detail through Bluetooth, Messages, or an E-mail.
 - Press **Delete** to delete a contact.

- Press Find duplicate contacts to search for duplicate contact information.
- Press Block this number to block a number.

Edit a Contact

- Use the Navigation Key O to select a contact on the contacts list screen.
- 2. Press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options**.
- 3. Select **Edit** and press the **OK Key** to **SAVE** the edit.

Share a Contact

You can share single contact information by sending the contact's vCard via Bluetooth, Messages, or E-mail.

- 2. Press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options**.
- 3. Select **Share** to share the single contact information.

Delete a Contact

- Press the Right Soft Key to access Options.
- 3. Select **Delete** to delete the selected contact number.
- 4. Press the **Right Soft Key** to confirm the deletion.

Import/Export Contacts

 Press the Right Soft Key on the contacts list screen to access Options. Select Settings > Import contacts/Export contacts to import/export contacts from/to memory card, Gmail, or Outlook.

Speed Dial

- Press the Right Soft Key on the contacts list screen to access Options.
- Select Settings > Set Speed Dial Contacts, use the Navigation Key

 to select 2-9, and press the OK Key

 to ASSIGN a contact.
- 3. Press the **OK Key** to confirm.
- Long press the 2-9 screen keys on the Home screen to dial the defined contacts.

Set ICE Contacts

- Press the Right Soft Key on the contacts list screen to access Options.
- Select Settings > Set ICE Contacts to add five contact numbers for setting these numbers as In case of emergency calls option.

Create Group

- Press the Right Soft Key on the contacts list screen to access Options.
- 2. Select Settings > Create Group > enter the Group Name.
- 3. Press the **Right Soft Key** to **Save** the group name.
- 4. Press Group > Name of the group > Left Soft Key from the contacts list to add contacts to the group.

Add Account

- Press the Right Soft Key on the contacts list screen to access Options.
- 2. Select Settings > Add Account.
- You can sync contacts, data, or other information from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

Calling

Make phone calls using a variety of calling features and services.

Making a Call

- Dial the desired number and press the CALL Key are or the OK Key to make the call.
- 2. If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by pressing the **CLR Key CLP**.
- 3. Press the **Right Soft Key** to display more **Options**:
 - Add to existing contact: Add the entered number to add another number to the contact.
 - Create new contact: Create a new contact with the entered number.

Make a call from your call log

- Press the OK Key and Call Log
 from the Home screen to access the call log.
- Choose the contact you want to dial, and press the CALL Key or the OK Key to make the call.

Make a call from Contacts

- From the Home screen, press the Right Soft Key to access Contacts.
- Choose the contact you want to dial, and press the CALL Key or the OK Key to make the call.

Making an emergency call

 If your phone has network coverage, dial the emergency number and press the CALL Key to make an emergency call. This option works without a SIM card or typing the PIN code.

Make an International call

To dial an international call, press the * key twice to enter + sign on the dial screen, enter the international country prefix followed by the complete phone number and press the CALL Key are or the OK Key to make the call.

Calling your Voicemail

· Press and hold to call and listen to your voicemail.

NOTE: You must contact your network operator to check for service availability.

Setting/Checking the Voicemail

Dial *86 and press the CALL Key are or the OK Key and follow the setup instructions.

NOTE:

- Voicemailbox not set up within 45 days will be canceled.
 Your voicemailbox is not password protected until you create a password by following the setup tutorial.
- Voicemail may not be available in some areas. Follow the setup instructions to password-protect your Verizon voicemail box.
- Verizon is not responsible for missed messages or deletions of messages from your voice mailbox, even if you have saved them.

Answering or Rejecting a Call

During an incoming call:

- Open the flip to answer, if Settings > Personalization >
 Answer Mode > Flip open to answer is ON. Otherwise, press the Left Soft Key or CALL to answer.
- Press the Right Soft Key or the End/Power Key to decline.
- Press the **OK Key** to reject the call by sending a preset message.
- To mute the ringtone volume of an incoming call, press the Volume Up/Down Key.

Hang up a Call

During a call:

- Open the flip and press the End/Power Key to end the call.
- · Open the flip and close the flip to end the call.

Messaging

Use the messaging feature to send and receive text (SMS) and multimedia (MMS) messages.

Sending a Message

- From the Home screen, press the OK Key and select Messages ■.
- 2. Press the **Left Soft Key** to write a **New** message.
- Enter the recipient's phone number in the To bar or press the Left Soft Key to add recipients from Contacts.
- Use the Navigation Key D to go to the SMS bar and enter the message.
- 5. Press the **OK Key** to SEND the text message.

Sending a Multimedia Message

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, contacts and sounds to other compatible phones and email addresses by pressing the **Right Soft Key** from an open text messages screen and then selecting **Add attachment.**

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, etc.) are attached.

NOTE: SMS messages longer than 160 characters will be charged as multiple SMS. SMS size will also be increased by specific letters (accent); hence, the recipient may receive multiple SMS.

Camera

Use the Camera app to take pictures.

From the Home screen, press the **OK Key** and select **Camera**

App Permission

The App Permission screen displays upon the first use of the Camera, asking for permission to know your location.

Press the OK Key
 to Allow or the Left Soft Key
 to
 Deny.

Take a Picture

1. By default, the Camera mode is selected.



- Position the object or landscape in the screen and press the OK Key
 to click a photo.
- 3. Photos are automatically saved to the Gallery app.
- After taking the photo, press the Left Soft Key to Preview.

- Press the Left Soft Key to select Zoom.
- Press the the Right Soft Key to Zoom In and the Left Soft Key to Zoom Out.

Options

Before clicking the picture, press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options** and the Left and Right **Navigation Key** to select any of the below options:

- Flash: Select the flash modes as Auto, On, or Off.
- Camera Resolution: Select the resolution as High, Standard, or Low.
- Self Timer: Sets the time a photo is taken after pressing the OK Key.
- Grid: Adds grid lines to the photo screen to help take better photos by using grid lines to align photo images.
- Gallery: Select Go to Gallery to view photos previously taken.
- Modes: Select to switch between Photo and Video mode.

Record a Video

Press the Right of the **Navigation Key**

to switch to the Video mode.



- 2. Press the Up or Down of the **Navigation Key** O to zoom the lens in and out.
- Press the **OK Key** to record a video, and press again to stop recording. Videos will be automatically saved to the **Video** ▶ app.
- After recording the video, press the Left Soft Key to Preview.
- Press the Right Soft Key to access Options and the Left and Right Navigation Key to select any of the below options:
 - Flash: Select the flash modes as Auto, On, or Off.
 - Video Resolution: Select the resolution as High, Standard, or Low.
 - Video: Select Go to Video to view the videos previously recorded.
 - Modes: Select to switch between Photo and Video mode.

Music

Use the music player to listen to your favorite tracks.

You can transfer music files and download music directly to your phone using the USB cable that came with your phone.

To access Music, press the **OK Key** \blacksquare from the Home screen and select **Music** \blacksquare .

Note

From the Home screen, press the **OK Key** and select **Note** ...

- Press the Left Soft Key to add New note > enter the contents > press the Right Soft Key to Save.
- Press the Right Soft Key on the notes list to access Options:
 - Delete
 - Share
 - Select multiple
 - Search
 - Sort by
- 3. Use the **Navigation Key** \square to select the note.
- 4. Press the **OK Key** to view the details.
- Press the **OK Key** to edit and **Right Soft Key** to Save the edit.

Video

The Video acts as a media player for you to view videos.

- From the Home screen, press the OK Key and select Video ►.
- Press the Left Soft Key to enter the Camera to record a video. For more information on video recording, see <u>Record</u> <u>a Video</u>.
- 3. Use the **Navigation Key** □ to select a recorded video, and press the **OK Key** to play the video.
- Press the Right Soft Key to access Options and the Up and Down Navigation Key to select any of the below options:
 - Share
 - File info
 - Delete
 - Select Multiple
 - About

Clock

From the Home screen, press the **OK Key** ■ and select **Clock** .

Alarm

From the Home screen, press the OK Key ■ and select

Clock > Alarm.

- **Key** and select
- Press the Left Soft Key to add a New alarm. The following options will appear:
 - Time Select to set the alarm time.
 - Repeat Select the days you want your alarm to go OFF.
 - Sound Select a ringtone for the alarm.
 - **Vibrate** Select to activate the vibration
 - Alarm Name Press to enter a name for the alarm.
- 3. Press the **Right Soft Key** to **Save** the new alarm.
 - Edit an Alarm: Select the alarm to edit > press the
 Right Soft Key to access Options > press Edit.
 - Delete/Delete All Alarm: Select alarm to delete >
 press Right Soft Key to access Options > press
 Delete or Delete all.

Timer

- From the Home screen, press the OK Key and select Clock ?> Timer.
- 2. Press the **OK Key** and then the Left or Right of the

Navigation Key O to edit Hour, Minute, and Second.

- 3. Press the **OK Key** to **START** the timer.
 - When the Timer is ongoing, press the OK Key
 to
 PAUSE and RESUME to continue the timer.
 - Press the **Right Soft Key** to add 1 minute.
 - Press the Left Soft Key to Reset the timer when the timer is paused.
- Once the timer is reset, press the Right Soft Key to select Settings such as:
 - Snooze
 - · System Alarm Volume
 - Vibrate
 - Sound

Stopwatch

- From the Home screen, press the OK Key and select Clock > Stopwatch.
- 2. Press the **OK Key** to **START** the Stopwatch.
 - When the Stopwatch is ongoing, press the Right Soft Key to record the Lap.
 - Press the **OK Key** To **PAUSE** the stopwatch.
 - Press the **OK Key** to **RESUME** the stopwatch when the stopwatch is paused.
 - Press the Left Soft Key to Reset the stopwatch and clear lap times.

File Manager

From the Home screen, press the **OK Key** and select **File Manager**.

File Manager displays all data stored on the phone and the microSD card, including applications, or other locations; videos, pictures, or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

File Manager allows you to perform the following operations: create (sub) folder, open folder/file, view, rename, move, copy, delete, play, share, and much more.

Calendar

Use the Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

View Calendar

- From the Home screen, press the OK Key and select Calendar
- Press the **OK Key** to view the **CALENDAR**. You can display the Calendar in Day, Week, Month view.
- 3. Press the **Right Soft Key** to select **Options** such as:
 - Week view
 - Day view
 - Go to date
 - Search
 - Calendar to display
 - Settings

Create New Event

- Press the Left Soft Key to Add new events from any Calendar view.
- 2. Fill in all required information for this new event.
- Press the **OK Key** to select **All-day event** if it is a wholeday event.
- 4. Press the **Right Soft Key** to Save.

Delete and Edit Event

After creating a new event, use the **Navigation Key** under the Month or Day view to move to the event.

- 1. Press the **OK Key** to show the events list.
- 2. Press the **Left Soft Key** to **Delete**.

-or-

3. Press the **Right Soft Key** to **Edit**.

Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event will appear on the Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives.

Utilities

Calculator

- From the Home screen, press the OK Key and select Utilities > Calculator ■.
 - 0-9: Input numbers
 - *: Decimal(.)
 - · #: +/-
 - Right Soft Key: Clear All
 - Left Soft Key: Clear

ToDo

- From the Home screen, press the OK Key and select Utilities > ToDo
- 2. Press the **Left Soft Key** to add a **New** task list.
- 3. Enter the List Name.
- 4. Press the **Right Soft Key** to Create.
- 5. Press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options** such as:
 - Edit
 - Delete
 - Delete all

Recorder

- From the Home screen, press the OK Key and select
 Utilities > Recorder ■
- 2. Press the **Left Soft Key** to create a **New** recording.

- 4. Use the **Navigation Key** to select the recording you want to playback.
- 5. Press the **OK Key** twice to play.
- 6. Press the **Right Soft Key** to access **Options** such as:
 - Delete
 - Share
 - Select multiple
 - Rename
 - Save as ringtone
 - · Save to music library
 - Settings

Gallery

The Gallery app provides one location to view and organize all your saved photos.

- From the Home screen, press the OK Key and select Gallery ■.
- Press the Left Soft Key to switch Favorites and Gallery list.
- Use the Navigation Key to select an image and press the OK Key ■ to open and view the image.
- 4. Press the **Right Soft Key** to access the Options:
 - Delete: Delete the selected photo.
 - **Edit:** Select this option to adjust exposure value, rotate the photo, crop, add filters, and auto-correction.
 - Add to favorites/Remove from favorites: Add/ Remove the selected photo to/from the Favorites list.
 - Share: Share the photo via Email, Messages, Bluetooth, etc.
 - Select multiple: This allows you to select more than one photo in the Gallery.
 - File info: Displays file name, size, image type, date taken. resolution. and path.
 - Sort and group: Sorts photos by date and time or groups by date.

Network & Connectivity

From the Home screen, press the **OK Key Settings > Network & Connectivity**.

Airplane Mode

When Airplane mode is ON, all wireless connections are disabled simultaneously, including Bluetooth and Wi-Fi.

- 1. Press the **OK Key** to enter **Airplane mode**.
- Press the Navigation Key to select ON or OFF, then press the OK Key to confirm.

Mobile network

Mobile network lets you choose your carrier.

- 1. Press the **OK Key** to enter Mobile network.
- 2. Press the **Navigation Key** O to access options:
 - Carrier: To select the network carrier.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi will allow you to surf the internet without using your device network when in range of a wireless network.

- 1. Press the **OK Key** to enter Wi-Fi.
- 2. Press the **Navigation Key** to select ON/OFF.
- 3. Press the **OK Key** to turn ON the Wi-Fi.
- 4. Press the Up and Down of the Navigation Key ☐ to select Available networks, then press the OK Key ☐ to enter all available networks list, select one, and press the OK Key ☐ to configure the access point and connect your phone.

- **NOTE:** You may need to enter a password if applicable.
- Press the Up and Down of the Navigation Key ☐ to select Advanced settings, then press the OK Key ☐ to set more options.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) with other Bluetooth devices within a close range, such as another phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, and so on.

- 1. Press the **OK Key** to enter Bluetooth.
- Press the Navigation Key □ to select ON, then press the OK Key ■ to turn on Bluetooth.
 - Visible to all Press the OK Key

 to enter, and select

 ON to view the list of visible devices.
 - My phone's name Press the OK Key
 to enter, edit
 the name, and press the Right Soft Key
 to Save.
 - Nearby devices Press the OK Key to enter the nearby devices list > use the Navigation Key □ to select the required device > press the OK Key to confirm > press the Right Soft Key to Pair.
 - Paired devices You can review the paired devices by pressing Bluetooth > Paired devices.

Geolocation

Geolocation is the use of location technologies such as GPS or IP addresses to identify and track the whereabouts of your device.

- 1. Press the **OK Key** to enter Geolocation.
- 2. Press the **Navigation Key** O to select ON or OFF.
- 3. Then Press the **OK Key** to confirm.

SIM manager

The SIM manager allows you to set SIM PIN, which prevents access to the SIM card cellular data networks.

- 1. Press the **OK Key** to enter **SIM manager**.
- Select SIM security > SIM PIN to select ON or OFF and press the OK Key to confirm.
- 3. Select Change SIM PIN.

NOTE: This option is available only if the **SIM PIN** is ON.

 Enter the SIM PIN > enter the new PIN twice > press the Right Soft Key to choose Done.

Call settings

Explore features and functionalities associated with making or answering calls.

- 1. Press the **OK Key** to enter **Call Settings**.
- 2. Select **Assisted dialing** and select the available options:
 - Assisted dialing
 - Reference country
 - Location

Wi-Fi Calling

Wi-Fi calling is a voice service that lets you place and receive calls over a Wi-Fi, as opposed to using a cellular signal.

- 1. Press the **OK Key** to enter Wi-Fi Calling.
- 2. Press the **Navigation Key** O to select ON or OFF.
- 3. Press the **OK Key** to confirm.

Wireless Emergency Alerts

A Wireless Emergency Alert is a public safety notification system that allows authorized agencies to send text-like messages to wireless device owners to alert them of emergencies.

- Press the **OK Key** to enter Wireless emergency alerts.
- Select Alert inbox to view received alerts.
- 3. Select any listed alerts and press **OK Key** to turn ON/OFF.
 - Presidential alerts This option cannot be turned OFF.
 - Extreme alert
 - Severe alert
 - AMBER alert
 - Public safety alert
 - · State/Local test alert
 - Test alerts
- Select Alert Reminder and press any of the below options, as applicable.
 - Once
 - · Every 2 minutes
 - · Every 15 minutes
 - Off
- 5. Select **WEA Vibrate** to receive alerts through vibration.
- 6. Select WEA Sound to set a notification sound for the alerts.
- 7. Select **WEA ringtone** to set a tone for the alerts.

Personalization

From the Home screen, press the **OK Key ■ > Settings** ② > **Personalization.**

Sound

To adjust Volume

 Press the Volume Up/Down button on the right side of the device to adjust the Ringtone & Alerts volume.

-or-

Lam unable to send and receive MMS.

- Check your phone memory availability, as it might be full.

- The service center may be swamped; try again later.

SIM card PIN locked.

 Contact your service provider to obtain the PUK code (Personal Unblocking Key).

· Check your subscription status with your service provider.

Others cannot detect the phone via Bluetooth.

- Ensure the Bluetooth is turned ON and your phone is visible to other users.

How to make your battery last longer.

- After a partial charge, the battery level indicator may not be exact.
