



### battery

### conserve battery charge

Using certain features can quickly deplete your battery's charge. **These features can include** 

# downloading music, replaying video clips, and using Bluetooth® wireless connections.

You can conserve your battery's charge by doing the following:

- Turn Bluetooth power off when not in use (see page 125).
- Turn off wallpaper (see page 37).
- Reduce backlight display time (see page 39).

# battery use & safety IMPORTANT: HANDLE AND STORE BATTERIES PROPERLY TO AVOID INJURY OR DAMAGE.

Most battery issues arise from improper handling of batteries, and particularly from the continued use of damaged batteries.

### DON'Ts:

- Don't disassemble, crush, puncture, shred, or otherwise attempt to change the form of your battery.
- Don't let the phone or battery come in contact with water. Water can get into the phone's circuits, leading to corrosion. If the phone and/or battery get wet, have them checked by your carrier or contact Motorola even if they appear to be working properly.
- Don't allow the battery to touch metal objects. If metal objects, such as jewelry, stay in prolonged contact with the battery contact points, the battery could become very hot.
- Don't place your battery near a heat source. Excessive heat can damage the phone or the battery. High temperatures can cause the battery to swell, leak, or malfunction. Therefore:

- Do not dry a wet or damp battery with an appliance or heat source, such as a hair dryer or microwave oven.
- Avoid leaving your phone in your car in high temperatures.

### DOs:

- Do avoid dropping the battery or phone.
   Dropping these items, especially on a hard surface, can potentially cause damage.
- Do contact your service provider or Motorola if your phone or battery has been damaged from dropping or high temperatures.

IMPORTANT: USE MOTOROLA ORIGINAL PRODUCTS FOR QUALITY ASSURANCE AND SAFEGUARDS. To aid consumers in identifying authentic Motorola batteries from non-original or counterfeit batteries (that may not have adequate

safety protection), Motorola provides holograms on its batteries. Consumers should confirm that any battery they purchase has a "Motorola Original" hologram.

# Motorola recommends you always use Motorola-branded batteries and chargers. Motorola mobile devices are designed to work with Motorola batteries. If you see a message on your display such as Invalid Battery or Unable to Charge, take the following steps:

- Remove the battery and inspect it to confirm that it has a "Motorola Original" hologram;
- If there is no hologram, the battery is not a Motorola battery;
- If there is a hologram, replace the battery and retry charging it;
- If the message remains, contact a Motorola Authorized Service Center.

**Important:** Motorola's warranty does not cover damage to the phone caused by non-Motorola batteries and/or chargers.

**Warning:** Use of a non-Motorola battery or charger may present a risk of fire, explosion, leakage, or other hazard.

# PROPER AND SAFE BATTERY DISPOSAL AND RECYCLING

### install the battery


 Press down and hold the battery cover release latch.



2 Lift the battery cover off the phone.



- With the gold contacts facing down and at the lower end of the battery, insert the battery, lower end first, and push it completely into place.
- To attach the battery cover, insert the lower end first, then press down on the sides and at the top to snap it into place.



### charge the battery

New batteries are not fully charged. Before you can use your phone, you need to install and charge the battery. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

### To charge using the charger:

- Insert the charger into the micro USB connector on your phone as shown.
- 2 Plug the other end of the charger into the appropriate electrical outlet.
- 3 When your phone displays Charge Complete, remove the charger.

**Tip:** Motorola batteries have circuitry that protects the battery from damage from overcharging.

When you charge the battery, the battery level indicator at the upper right of the screen shows charging progress. At least one segment of the indicator must be visible to ensure full phone functionality while charging.

### To charge from your computer:

You can also charge your phone's battery by connecting a cable from your phone's micro USB port to a high-power USB connector on a computer (not a low-power one, such as the USB connector on your keyboard or bus-powered USB hub). Typically, USB high-power connectors are located directly on your computer.

Both your phone and your computer must be turned on, and you must have correct software drivers installed on your computer. Cables and software drivers are available in Motorola Original™ data kits, sold separately.

### turn it on & off

To turn on your phone, press and hold the Power/End Key (③) until the display turns on.

The phone may require several seconds to turn on. If prompted, use the keypad to enter your four-digit unlock code (which, by default, is the last four digits of your phone number) and press the Center Select Key (③) (0K) to unlock the phone.

**To turn off your phone**, press and hold the Power/End Key (**(**).

### make a call

**Note:** For instructions on making Push to Talk calls, see page 68.

Enter a phone number, Area Code first, if applicable, and press the Send Key ( $\bigcirc$ ) to make a call.

To make a call outside the U.S.A., press and hold **③** until you see +. Next, press the number keys to dial the **country code** and **phone number**, and then press the Send Key (**⑥**).

### answer a call

**Note:** For instructions on answering Push to Talk calls, see page 71.

When your phone rings and/or vibrates, press the Send Key (((a)) to answer.

**Tip:** You can set the phone to answer calls when you open the flip (see page 37).

### end a call

To hang up, press the Power/End Key (160).

You can also end a call by closing the flip, **if you are not connected to a headset or a handsfree car kit**. Closing the flip does not end:

- a data connection using a USB cable to connect the phone to a computer
- · a Push to Talk call

- wallpapers, screen savers, banners, and other similar applications
- active BREW® download sessions, such as downloading music or ringtones

# store a phone number

To store a phone number when **PTT Mode is set to Off**:

- 1 From the main screen, use the keypad to enter a phone number and press the Left Soft Key (①) (Save).
- 2 Select Add New Contact by pressing the Center Select Key (((a)) (OK).
- 3 Use the Navigation Key (♠) to scroll to an entry type and press the Center Select Key (♠) (OK).

4 Use the keypad to enter a name and other details for the phone number and press the Center Select Key ((a)) (Save) to store the number.

# call a stored phone number

**Note:** For instructions on calling a PTT contact, see page 68.


- 1 From the main screen, press the Right Soft Key (①) (Contacts) to open the CONTACT LIST.
- 2 Scroll to the Contacts entry.
  - If the entry has more than one phone number, press right or left on the Navigation Key (((iii))) to toggle between the numbers.
- **3** Press the Send Key (**(()**) to call the entry.

# basics

### main screen

The main screen appears when you turn on the phone.



Press the Center Select Key ((28)) (MENU) to open the main menu. Soft Key labels show current soft key functions. (For soft key locations, see page 2.)

**Tip:** You can quickly select a menu option by pressing the number for that option. For example, from the **SETTINGS & TOOLS** menu, press (s) to select **Display Settings**.

From the main screen, you can press up, down, left, or right on the Navigation Key (③) to open these shortcuts:

left	MUSIC & TONES
right	MEDIA CENTER

# adjust volume

Press the Volume Keys to:

- · turn off an incoming call alert
- change the earpiece volume during calls
- change the ringer volume from the main screen (see page 21)

# change sound settings

Press the Volume Keys up or down to cycle the MASTER VOLUME through High, Medium High, Medium, Medium Low, Low, Vibrate Only, Alarm Only, and All Sounds Off.



### handsfree

**Note:** The use of wireless phones while driving may cause distraction. Discontinue a call if you can't concentrate on driving. Additionally, the use of wireless devices and their accessories may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. Always obey the laws and regulations on the use of these products.

### handsfree speaker

You can use your phone's handsfree speaker to make calls without holding the phone to your ear.

speaker during a call, press and hold the Smart/Speakerphone Key (on the right side of the phone—see page 2).

To activate the handsfree



You will hear an audible alert, and your phone will show the speakerphone indicator ■ and SPEAKER PHONE ON on the main screen.

The handsfree speaker stays on until you press and hold the Smart/Speakerphone Key again or turn off the phone.

To turn off the handsfree speaker, press and hold the Smart/Speakerphone Key. Your phone will show SPEAKER PHONE OFF on the main screen.

**To end the call**, press the Power/End Key (**( )**). You will hear an audible alert.

**Note:** The handsfree speaker won't work when your phone is connected to a handsfree car kit or headset.

# accessory volume settings (car kit or headset)



To adjust volume of headsets or car kit accessories that are enabled for Bluetooth wireless connections,

press your phone's Volume Keys up or down during an active call.

### standalone mode

**Note:** Consult airline staff about the use of **Standalone Mode** in flight. Turn off your phone whenever instructed to do so by airline staff.

Use *standalone mode* to turn off your phone's calling features in locations where wireless phone use is prohibited. **You cannot make or receive calls or use Bluetooth in standalone mode**, but you can use your phone's other non-calling features.

- 1 From the main screen, press the Center Select Key (③) (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Navigation Key (((a)) to scroll to
  (\*\*SETTINGS & TOOLS and press the Center Select
  Key (((a)) (OK)).

- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the Center Select Key ((20)) (OK).
- 4 Press Center Select Key (

  ) (OK) to select Standalone Mode.
- 5 Select On and press the Center Select Key (③) (OK).

When **Standalone Mode** is set to **On**, your phone displays indicators and a message on the main screen:



# change lock code

Your phone's four-digit **lock code** is originally set to the last four digits of your phone number. To change the lock code:

- 1 From the main screen, press the Center Select Key (((\*)) (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Navigation Key (((iii)) to scroll to ((iii) SETTINGS & TOOLS and press the Center Select Key (((iii)) (OK)).
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the Center Select Key ((3)) (OK).
- 4 Scroll to Security and press the Center Select Key ((S)) (OK).
- 5 When prompted, enter the lock code and press the Center Select Key ((3)) (OK).
- 6 Scroll to Edit Codes and press the Center Select Key (((a)) (OK)).

- 7 Scroll to Phone Only and press the Center Select Key (((a)) (OK).
- 8 Enter the new four-digit lock code in the Enter New Code entry area, then press down on the Navigation Key ((((iii))) to move the cursor into the Re-Enter New Code entry area. Re-enter the new four-digit lock code.
- 9 Press the Center Select Key ( ) (0K).

# lock & unlock phone

You can lock your phone to keep others from using it. To lock or unlock your phone, you need the four-digit lock code (which is originally set to the last four digits of your phone number).

**Note:** You can make emergency calls on a locked phone (see page 51). A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages.

To manually lock your phone:

- 1 From the main screen, press the Center Select Key (((\*\*)) (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Navigation Key (◎) to scroll to

  (※ SETTINGS & TOOLS and press the Center Select

  Key (⑥) (OK).
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the Center Select Key ((a)) (OK).
- Scroll to Security and press the Center Select Key ((O)) (OK).
- When prompted, enter the lock code and press the Center Select Key ( ) (0K).
- 6 Scroll to Lock Phone Now and press the Center Select Key (③) (OK).

To **automatically lock** your phone whenever you turn it off:

1 From the main screen, press the Center Select Key (((R)) (MENU) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the Navigation Key (((())) to scroll to ((\*) SETTINGS & TOOLS and press the Center Select Key (((())) (OK)).
- Scroll to Phone Settings and press the Center Select Key ((a)) (OK).
- 4 Scroll to **Security** and press the Center Select Key (**©**) (**OK**).
- 5 When prompted, enter the lock code and press the Center Select Key ((a)) (0K).
- 6 Scroll to Phone Lock and press the Center Select Key (③) (OK).
- 7 Scroll to On Power Up and press the Center Select Key (((\*\*)) (OK).
- 8 Press the Power/End Key (16) to return to the main screen

To unlock the phone, enter the four-digit lock code in the Enter Lock Code entry area and press the Center Select Key ((©)) (OK).

# lock side keys when flip is closed

When the phone's flip is closed, you can lock the side keys to prevent accidental key presses.

To lock the side keys, press and hold the smart/speakerphone key on the right side of the phone (see page 2). Your phone shows **KEYPAD LOCKED** on the main screen. To unlock the side keys, press and hold the smart/speakerphone key again, or open the flip.

# manage memory



**Note:** The microSD memory card is an **optional accessory**, available separately.

You can store multimedia content such as songs and photos on your phone's internal memory or on a removable microSD memory card.

**Note:** If you download a copyrighted file to your phone and store it on your memory card, you can use the file only when your memory card is inserted in your phone. You cannot send, copy, or change copyrighted files.

### install memory card

1 Remove the battery door from your phone (see page 13).

With the gold contacts down, slide the memory card into the card slot and push the card in completely.



3 Replace the battery door.

**Caution:** Do not remove your memory card while your phone is using it or writing files to it.

**To remove the memory card**, press down lightly on the card, then carefully pull it out.

# set memory for multimedia content

You can download and store multimedia content in phone memory or on the memory card:

1 From the main screen, press the Center Select Key (((a)) (MENU) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the Navigation Key (((a)) to scroll to (3 SETTINGS & TOOLS and press the Center Select Key (((a)) (OK)).
- 3 Scroll to Memory and press the Center Select Key (

  (OK)).
- 4 Scroll to Save Options and press the Center Select Key (((\*\*)) (OK)).
- 5 Scroll to Pictures, Videos, or Sounds, and press the Center Select Key (

  (OK).
- 6 Select Phone Memory or Card Memory and press the Center Select Key ((a)) (OK).

### view memory information

- 1 From the main screen, press the Center Select Key (((a)) (MENU) to open the menu.

# move files from phone to memory card

**Note:** Moving a file to the memory card deletes it from phone memory.

### To move photos or video clips:

# TTY operation

You can use an optional teletypewriter (TTY) device with your phone to send and receive calls. You must plug the TTY device into the phone's headset connector and set the phone to operate in one of three TTY modes

### Notes:

 A TTY is a communication device used by people who are hard of hearing or have a speech impairment. TTY does not work from mobile phone to mobile phone.

- Use a TSB-121 compliant cable (provided by the TTY manufacturer) to connect the TTY device to your phone. Your phone has a 2.5mm jack.
- Set the phone to Medium volume level for proper operation. If you experience a high number of incorrect characters, adjust the volume as needed to minimize the error rate.
- For optimal performance, your phone should be at least 12 inches (30 centimeters) from the TTY device. Placing the phone too close to the TTY device may cause high error rates.

### set TTY mode

When you set your phone to a TTY mode, it operates in that mode whenever a TTY device is connected.

When your phone is in a TTY mode, your phone displays the international TTY mode, the international TTY symbol, and the mode setting during an active TTY call.

### return to voice mode

To return to standard voice mode, select **TTY OFF** from the **TTY MODE** menu.

# AGPS & your location



Your phone can use the *automatic location information* (ALI) feature, along with *Assisted Global Positioning System* (AGPS) satellite signals, to tell the network where you are physically located.

When ALI is set to Location On, your phone displays the  $\Phi$  (ALI on) indicator. Services may use your known location to provide useful information (for example, driving directions, or the location of the nearest bank). Your phone prompts you when the network or a

service asks for your location. You can refuse at this point.

When ALI is set to **E911 Only**, your phone displays the  $\Phi$  (ALI off) indicator, and the phone does not send location information unless you call the emergency phone number (such as 911).

- 1 From the main screen, press the Center Select Key (((x)) (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Navigation Key (◎) to scroll to

  (★ SETTINGS & TOOLS and press the Center Select

  Key (◎) (OK).
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the Center Select Key ( ( ) ( ) ( ) ( ) ( )
- 4 Scroll to Location and press the Center Select Key ((ix)) (OK).
- 5 Scroll to Location On or E911 Only.
- **6** Press the Center Select Key ((**®**)) (**0K**) to select the setting.

## AGPS limitations & tips

Your phone uses Assisted Global Positioning System (AGPS) satellite signals to estimate your location. If your phone cannot find strong satellite signals, your AGPS might be slower, less accurate, or it might not work at all. AGPS provides only an approximate location, often within 150 feet (45 meters) but sometimes much farther from your actual location.

#### To improve AGPS accuracy:

 Go outside and away from underground locations, covered vehicles, structures with metal or concrete roofs, tall buildings, and foliage. Indoor performance might improve if you move closer to window, but some window sun-shielding films can block satellite signals.

- Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.
- If your phone has a retractable antenna, extend the antenna.
- Hold your phone away from your body, and point the phone antenna toward the sky. Do not cover the antenna area with your fingers.

AGPS uses satellites controlled by the U.S. government and subject to changes implemented in accordance with the Department of Defense AGPS user policy and the Federal Radio Navigation Plan. These changes might affect AGPS performance.

To activate speed dialing, you must set One Touch Dial to On:

1 From the main screen, press the Center Select Key ( ) (MENU) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the Navigation Key (((())) to scroll to ((\*) SETTINGS & TOOLS and press the Center Select Key (((())) (OK)).
- 3 Scroll to Call Settings and press the Center Select Key (((OK))) (OK).
- 4 Scroll to One Touch Dial and press the Center Select Key (②) (OK).
- 5 Scroll to 0n and press the Center Select Key ((3)) (0K).

#### To speed dial an entry:

Call speed dial entries 1 through 9 by pressing and holding the one-digit speed dial number for one second.

For two-digit speed dial numbers, enter the first number, then press and hold the second number for one second.

## emergency calls

Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers, such as 911, that you can call at any time, **even when your phone is locked**.

**Note:** Check with your service provider, as emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues. Do not solely rely on your wireless phone for essential communications such as medical emergencies.

**To make an emergency call:** Turn your phone on, exit any open application such as games, dial the emergency number, then press the Send Key ( ) to call the emergency number.

## AGPS during an emergency call



When you make an emergency call, your phone can use *Assisted Global Positioning System* (AGPS) satellite signals to tell the emergency response center your approximate location.

The AGPS feature has limitations, so always tell the emergency response center your best knowledge of your location. Remain on the phone for as long as the emergency response center instructs you.

AGPS **might not work** for emergency calls:

- Your phone's AGPS feature must be turned on (see page 40).
- Your local emergency response center might not process AGPS location information. For details, contact your local authorities.

#### For best results:

- Go outside and away from underground locations, covered vehicles, structures with metal or concrete roofs, tall buildings, and foliage. Indoor performance might improve if you move closer to windows, but some window sun shielding films can block satellite signals.
- Move away from radios, entertainment equipment, and other electronic devices that might interfere with or block AGPS satellite signals.

If your phone cannot find strong AGPS satellite signals, the location of the nearest cell tower in contact with your phone is automatically provided to the emergency response center.

## international calls

If your phone service includes international dialing, press and hold 🔀 to insert your local international access code (indicated by +). Then, use the keypad to dial the country code and phone number.

## voicemail

Your network stores the voicemail messages you receive. When you **receive** a voicemail message, your phone shows the voicemail message indicator **2**".

**Note:** Your service provider may include additional information about using this feature.

Select Listen Now by pressing the Center Select Key (((a)) (OK) to dial voicemail.

or

Use the Navigation Key ( $\bigcirc$ ) to scroll to **Listen Later**, then press the Center Select Key ( $\bigcirc$ ) (**OK**).

The voicemail message indicator ( $\mathbb{Z}^{"}$ ) appears on the bottom of the screen until you listen to your message or until you go to  $\mathbb{Z}$  MESSAGING > Voicemail and press the Left Soft Key ( $\mathbb{O}$ ) (Clear).

To check voicemail messages later, press and hold ① to call your voicemail number, or go to

MESSAGING > Voicemail and press the Center Select Key (③) (OK).

## in-call options

During an active call, press **OPTIONS** to access these options:

Messaging Main Menu
Contact List Notepad
Recent Calls Voice Record

**Note:** When your phone is connected to a Bluetooth device during a call, you may also see **Audio to Phone** and **Disconnect Bluetooth** options. When your phone is in a TTY mode (see page 29), you may also see a **TTY Setup** option.

# call times & data volumes

Network connection time is the elapsed time from the moment you connect to your service provider's network to the moment you end the call by pressing the Power/End Key (((a))). This time includes busy signals and ringing.

The amount of network connection time you track on your resettable timer may not equal the amount of time for which you are billed by your service provider. For billing information, contact your service provider.

#### DTMF tones

Your phone can send *Dual-tone multi-frequency* (DTMF) tones for calling card calls or to navigate automated systems (such as banking by phone).



## select entry mode

Multiple entry modes make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The default mode is **Abc** (tap mode, first character of a sentence in uppercase).

To select an entry mode from a text entry screen, press the Left Soft Key (⊙), then select an entry mode.

## tap mode

This is the standard mode for entering text on your phone. Regular tap mode cycles through the letters, numbers, and symbols of the key you press.

- 1 Press a key once to insert the first letter on the key, twice for the second letter, and so on. If you pause briefly, your phone accepts the last letter displayed and waits for the next entry.
- **2** Enter the remaining characters in the same way.

Tip: Press # to enter a space.

## iTAP® mode

iTAP software provides a predictive text entry method that combines your key presses into common words.

When you enter three or more letters in a row, your phone may guess the rest of the word. For example, if you enter prog, your phone might show:



If you want a different word (such as progress), continue pressing keys to enter the remaining letters.

If you enter a word the phone does not recognize, the phone stores it as a new word option. When you fill memory space for new word options, your phone deletes the oldest words to add new ones.

- Press up or down on the Navigation Key (((()))
  to view other possible combinations, and
  select the one you want.
- Press right on the Navigation Key (
   (
   ) to enter
  the highlighted combination when it spells a
  word. A space is inserted automatically after
  the word.
- To enter numbers quickly, press and hold a number key to temporarily switch to numeric mode. Press the number keys to enter the numbers you want.
- Press 
   ① to enter punctuation or other characters.

## numeric mode

After selecting numeric mode, press number keys to enter the numbers you want. When you finish entering numbers, press the Left Soft Key (①) (123) to switch to another entry mode.

## symbol mode

In the SYMBOLS screen, use the Navigation Key ( $\bigcirc$ ) to scroll to a symbol and press the Center Select Key ( $\bigcirc$ ) (0K) to select it.

To search for additional symbols, press the Right Soft Key  $(\bigcirc)$  (Next) to page down to the next set of symbols. Press the Left Soft Key  $(\bigcirc)$  (Prev) to page up to the previous set.

## text entry tips

To enter a space, press #.

**To enter punctuation while entering text**, press nepeatedly to enter a punctuation mark or other character.

To edit or delete text while entering text, press right on the Navigation Key (⊚) to move the cursor to the right of text you want to edit. Press the Clear Key (⊕) to delete the character to the left of the cursor. Press and hold the Clear Key (⊕) to delete an entire word

## push to talk

Your phone supports *Push to Talk* (PTT), which allows you to use your phone like a walkie-talkie to communicate with an individual or group of individuals who are also Verizon Wireless® Push To Talk subscribers.

## activate PTT mode

You must activate PTT mode to use the PTT functions of your phone (for example, access the PTT CONTACT LIST, send and receive PTT calls, etc.).

1 From the main screen, press the Center Select Key ( ) (MENU) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the Navigation Key (◎) to scroll to

## PTT calls

**Note:** PTT Mode must be set to **On** (see page 64) to use PTT features.

You can make a **private** PTT call or a **group** PTT call to other Verizon Wireless® PTT subscribers.

A **private** PTT call is a one-to-one call to another Verizon Wireless PTT subscriber that you initiate by entering the recipient's ten-digit number or by selecting an entry in your **PTT CONTACT LIST**.

A **group** call is a call to all available members of the selected group from your **PTT CONTACT LIST** or **PTT GROUPS** list.

You can make two types of PTT calls:

- Alert call—When you place an alert call, the PTT call recipient's phone plays an audible tone and displays a message indicating that someone wants to speak to the recipient. The recipient can accept or decline the call. Alert calls can't be sent to groups.
- Barge call—When you place a barge call, the recipient's phone plays an audible tone, and the call automatically connects.

#### PTT call basics

**To speak** during a PTT call, hold the PTT Key and speak after the tone. Only one person can speak at a time.

To let others speak, release the PTT Key.

To end a call, press the Power/End Key (1961).

#### make a PTT call

**Note:** To make PTT calls, you must set **PTT Mode** to **On** (see page 64).

#### barge call from PTT Contact List

- 1 Press the PTT Key to access your PTT CONTACT LIST.
- 2 Use the Navigation Key (((iii)) to highlight the PTT Contact entry you want to call.
- 3 Press and hold the PTT Key, and listen for the "OK to Talk" tone. The message Connected to will

- appear on the main screen. Speak while holding the PTT Key down.
- 4 Release the PTT Key when finished speaking. This allows the called party to reply.
- **5** Press the Power/End Key (**③**) to end the call.

#### alert call from PTT Contact List

You can send an alert to any user with Verizon Wireless PTT service. The called party may answer or ignore the alert.

- Press the PTT Key to access your PTT CONTACT LIST.
- 2 Use the Navigation Key ((()) to highlight the PTT Contact entry you want to call.
- 3 Press the Left Soft Key ( ) (Alert). Your phone will display Press PTT Key to Alert.
- 4 Press the PTT key to alert the selected individual. Your phone plays "PTT Outgoing Alert" tones and displays Alerting.

If the called party answers the alert, your phone displays **Listening to**, and you will hear the called party speaking. If the called party chooses to ignore the alert, or if the phone is unavailable to accept a PTT call, your phone will display **Unavailable**.

When the called party is finished speaking, you will hear the "Floor Available" tone, and your phone will display **Connected to**.

- 5 Press and hold the PTT Key to talk.
- **6** Release the PTT Key when finished speaking. This allows the called party to reply.
- **7** Press the Power/End Key (**③**) to end the call.

#### barge call from keypad

1 Enter the ten-digit wireless number of the Verizon Wireless PTT subscriber you wish to contact.

- 2 Press the PTT Key. Listen for the "Okay to Talk" tone. Your phone will display Connected to. Speak while holding the PTT Key down.
  - If the wireless number you entered is included in your PTT Contact List, the contact name will replace the wireless number entered on the screen when the call is initiated.
- 3 Release the PTT Key when finished speaking. This allows the called party to reply.
- 4 Press the Power/End Key (1961) to end the call.

#### alert call from keypad

- 1 Enter the ten-digit wireless number of the Verizon Wireless PTT subscriber you wish to contact.
- 2 Press the Left Soft Key (①) (Alert).

3 Press and release the PTT Key to alert the individual.

Your phone plays the PTT "Outgoing Alert" tone and displays **Alerting**. If the wireless number you entered is included in your PTT Contact List, the contact name will replace the wireless number entered on the screen when the alert is initiated.

If the called party answers the alert, your phone displays Listening to, and you will hear the called party speaking. If the called party chooses to ignore the alert, or if the phone is unavailable to accept a PTT call, you will see Unavailable

When the called party is finished speaking, your phone plays the "Floor Available" tone and display Connected to.

4 Press and hold the PTT Key to talk.

- 5 Release the PTT Key when finished speaking. This allows the called party to reply.
- 6 Press the Power/End Key (②) to end the call.

#### temporary group calls

You can set up a temporary group call to a set of PTT contacts already in your PTT contact list. A *temporary group* is a new group that you define for a single call and is not stored as a group in the PTT contact list.

**Note:** To make PTT calls, you must set **PTT Mode** to **On** (see page 64).

- 1 Press the PTT Key to access the PTT Contact List.
- 2 Press the Right Soft Key (①) (Options).
- 3 Select Temp PTT Group and press the Center Select Key (((a))) (OK).
- 4 Press the Center Select Key (((R)) (ADD) to add new members.

- Select members from your PTT contacts by pressing the Center Select Key ((ax)) (MARK). When finished adding members, press the Left Soft Key (3)) (DONE).
- 6 Press and hold the PTT Key to make a barge call to the group you just defined.

**Note:** After you define a temporary group for the first time, your phone automatically includes the PTT contacts from that group in the next temporary group you define. For your next temporary group call, you can add and remove PTT contacts as desired.

**Tip:** If you decide you want to **keep a temporary group**, you can save it as a permanent group: In the **TEMP PTT GROUP** screen, press the Right Soft Key  $(\bigodot)$  (Options), then select **Save As PTT Group** and press the Center Select Key  $(\bigodot)$  (OK).

### answer a PTT call

**Note:** To receive PTT calls, your must set **PTT Mode** to **On** (see page 64).

### incoming barge call

When you receive a barge call, your phone plays the "Barge" tone. You then hear the calling party speaking. Your phone will display the calling party's wireless number. If the calling party's number is saved in your PTT Contact List, the contact name will replace the wireless number on the screen.

- 1 Press and hold the PTT Key to talk.
- 2 Release the PTT Key to let the other party talk.
- **3** Press the Power/End Key (**⑤**) to end the call.

### incoming alert call

When you receive an alert, your phone plays the "PTT Alert" tone and displays Incoming Alert, along with the phone number or contact name of the calling party. The "PTT Alert" tone repeats every five seconds until it is answered or ignored, or until twenty seconds have passed.

- You can choose to answer or ignore the alert.
  To answer the alert, press and hold the PTT Key, and begin talking. To ignore the alert, press the Right Soft Key (①) (Ignore).
- **2** Release the PTT Key to let the other party talk.
- 3 Press the Power/End Key (1) to end the call.

### return the last PTT call

To quickly call the last PTT call that you dialed or received: Press and hold the PTT Key. The phone finds the last call you made or received and makes a barge call to that number.

## handsfree speaker for PTT calls

**Caution:** During an active PTT call, pressing the Smart/Speakerphone Key, **with the flip closed**, ends the call.

When you **make a PTT call**, your phone automatically uses the handsfree speaker (see page 22) during the call unless you press and hold the Smart/Speakerphone Key, with the flip open.

When you **receive a PTT call**, your phone automatically uses the handsfree speaker unless you have set **Master Volume** to **Vibrate Only**, **Alarm Only**, or **All Sounds Off** (see page 21).

## PTT alert tones

Your phone plays audible PTT alert tones when:

- you can speak during an active PTT call (no one else is speaking)
- you are receiving a barge call
- you push a button while someone else on the call is talking
- · you are receiving an alert call
- you have originated an alert call
- the phone you are calling is busy or unavailable
- when the floor is available for you to speak

# Push to Talk

Push to Talk calls may only be made with other Verizon Wireless® Push to Talk subscribers, and only from the National Enhanced Services Rate and Coverage Area. For optimal Push to Talk performance, all callers on a Push to Talk session must have an EVDO capable device and be receiving EVDO service. A Push to Talk call is terminated by pressing **END** or will automatically time out after ten (10) seconds of inactivity. While you are on a Push to Talk call, voice calls received will go directly to Voice Mail. When you are on a voice call. vou cannot receive a Push to Talk call. You cannot prevent others who have your wireless phone number from entering you into their Push to Talk contact list.

Only one person can speak at a time during Push to Talk calls. When using your phone keypad to make a Push to Talk call, you must enter the ten-digit phone number of the called party. Presence information may not be available for all Push to Talk contacts. The timeliness of presence information may be impacted by the network registration status of a Push to Talk contact. Your Push to Talk service cannot be used for any applications that tether your phone to computers or other devices for any purpose. Push to Talk-capable phone and service required.



- 1 From the PLAYLISTS screen, scroll to the playlist you want to edit and press the Right Soft Key ( ( ) (Options).
- 2 Use the Navigation Key (((iii)) to scroll to Edit playlist and press the Center Select Key (((iv)) (0K)).
- 3 Edit the playlist as desired.

To change the order of songs in your playlist, scroll to a song and press the Center Select Key ((\overline{\text{N}})) (Move). Then scroll up or down to move the song up or down in the playlist. When finished, press the Center Select Key ((\overline{\text{N}})) (Save).

To delete a song, scroll to the song and press the Left Soft Key  $(\bigcirc)$  (Remove).

4 Press the Clear Key ((a)) to return to the previous screen or Power/End Key ((b)) to return to the main screen.

# record & play voice records

You can create a voice record that you can play back later as a reminder for yourself.

### create voice record

- 1 From the main screen, press left on the Navigation Key (②) to access MUSIC &TONES.
- 2 Use the Navigation Key (((a)) to scroll to My Sounds and press the Center Select Key (((a)) (OK).
- Select Record New and press the Center Select Key ((\*\*)) (OK).
- Press the Center Select Key ((30)) (OK) to begin recording, then press the Center Select Key ((30)) (STOP) when finished.

To save the voice record, press the Left Soft Key ( (Save).

To erase the voice record, press the Right Soft Key ( $\bigcirc$ ) (Erase).

**Tip:** To create a voice record quickly, press and hold the Voice Command Key (on the right side of the phone), then press the Center Select Key (o) (**OK**) to begin recording. Press the Center Select Key (o) (**STOP**) when finished. You can press the Left Soft Key (o) (**Save**) to save it, press the Center Select Key (o) (**SEND**) to send it, or press the Right Soft Key (o) (**Frase**) to erase it. Press the Power/End Key (o) to exit. When you see the message **Do you want** to exit?, use the Navigation Key (o) to select **Yes** or **No**, and press the Center Select Key (o) (**OK**).

### play voice record

- 1 From the main screen, press left on the Navigation Key (③) to access MUSIC &TONES.
- 2 Use the Navigation Key ((()) to scroll to My Sounds and press the Center Select Key ((()) (0K).
- 3 Scroll to the file name of the desired voice record and press the Center Select Key ((\*\*)) (PLAY).

Tip: You can rename voice records. In My Sounds, your phone displays an 

indicator beside the names of voice records that you created. Scroll to the voice record you want to rename, press the Right Soft Key (⊙) (Options), then scroll to and select Rename. Enter the new name for the voice record and press the Center Select Key (⊚) (OK). Your phone will display SOUND NAME SAVED.

- Fress the Left Soft Key (♠) (Save) to save the video clip.

### or

Press the Center Select Key (send) (SEND) to save the video clip and go to the NEW VIDEO MESSAGE screen.

### or

Press the Right Soft Key (①) (Erase) to delete the video clip and return to the active viewfinder.


Your phone has a 2 megapixel digital camera that can take photos at up to  $1600 \times 1200$  pixels resolution. You can take a photo with your phone and send it in a multimedia message to other wireless phone users.

When the phone's flip is open, your camera lens is on the back of your phone (see page 2). **To get the clearest photos, wipe the lens clean with a soft, dry cloth before you capture a photo.** 

### take a photo

1 To activate the camera, press the Camera/Video Key ((a)).

The active viewfinder image appears on your phone's screen:



Press left and right on the Navigation Key ((()) to zoom in and out

Press the Right Soft Key ( $\bigcirc$ ) (Options) to see more options.

- Point the camera lens at the camera subject and press the Center Select Key ( ) (TAKE).
- 3 Press the Center Select Key (♠) (SEND) to save the photo and go to the NEW PICTURE MESSAGE screen.

#### or

Press the Left Soft Key  $(\bigcirc)$  (Save) to save the picture in MY PICTURES.

#### or

Press the Right Soft Key ((()) (Erase) to delete the photo and return to the active viewfinder.

### adjust camera settings

When the camera is active, press the Right Soft Key (①) (Options) to select from these settings:

- 2 Use the Navigation Key (♠) to scroll to In Case of Emergency and press the Center Select Key (♠) (OK).

3 Scroll to CONTACT 1, CONTACT 2, or CONTACT 3, and press the Center Select Key ((2)) (ADD).

To change an emergency contact, scroll to the contact and press the Right Soft Key (①) (Options), then select Re-assign.

**Note:** Select **Personal Info** to add personal information that may assist emergency workers.

4 To add a contact from the CONTACT LIST, select From Contacts, scroll to the contact you want to add, and press the Center Select Key (() (0K)).

To enter a new contact, select New Contact, enter the contact information, and press the Center Select Key ( $\bigcirc$ ) (SAVE).

- 5 Press the Center Select Key ( (SAVE).

**Note:** Master Volume must be set to High, Medium High, Medium, Medium Low, or Low (see page 21).

### download ringtone for an entry

- 3 Scroll to Ringtone and press the Left Soft Key (①) (Set) to go to the MY RINGTONES menu.
- 4 Select Get New App and proceed to download and save a ringtone.

**Tip:** You can also download a ringtone from the MUSIC & TONES menu. From the home screen, press right on the Navigation Key ((()) to access WEDIA CENTER, and select Music & Tones. Next, select Get New Ringtones, or select My Ringtones and then Get New Application.

### add entries to group

To send a text message to many people at once, you can create a group and add contact entries to it.

- 5 Scroll to Add and press the Center Select Key ((iv)) (OK).
- On the ADD CONTACTS screen, scroll to each contact you want to add and press the Center Select Key (

- 7 When you finish adding contacts to a group, press the Left Soft Key (①) (Done).

**Tip:** To add a **Contacts** entry to a group while editing the entry, scroll to **Group** and press the Left Soft Key  $(\bigcirc)$  (Set).

### voice recognition

Your phone's voice recognition feature lets you make calls and complete other actions by speaking commands to your phone.

### voice recognition tips

 When speaking the name of a Contacts entry, say the name exactly as it is listed. For example, to call the mobile number for an entry named Bill Smith, say "Call Bill Smith mobile." (If the entry includes only one number for Bill Smith, say "Call Bill Smith.")

- Speak numbers at a normal speed and volume, and pronounce each digit distinctly.
   Avoid pausing between digits.
- You can set your phone to play voice command instructions through the speakerphone by pressing the Voice Command Key, which opens the VOICE COMMANDS menu. If you use the Call command to place a call, audio plays through the phone's earpiece when the call connects. You can turn this feature off (see page 116).

### voice commands

1 With the phone flip closed, press and hold the Voice Command Key on the right side of the phone.

**Note:** With the phone open, press and release the Voice Command Key (see page 3). Pressing and holding the key activates voice recording.

Set your phone to say numbers aloud as you press them on the keypad.

#### Confirmation

If your phone is not sure that it has correctly identified a name or number that you speak, it can display up to three choices and prompt you to confirm the correct one.

You can control when choice lists appear:

**Automatic**—Display a list of choices from multiple alternatives.

**Always Confirm**—Always display a list of choices when there are multiple alternatives.

**Never Confirm**—Never display a choice list. The phone chooses from the best alternatives.

#### voice recognition settings

#### Sensitivity

You can fine tune your phone's ability to recognize voice commands. Select Most Sensitive, Recommended, or Least Sensitive.

If sensitivity is too strict, your phone often rejects voice commands and displays "Please repeat..." or "No match found." Select Most Sensitive.

If sensitivity is too forgiving, you experience false activations (indicating that the phone detects a wrong match). Select Least Sensitive.

### Adaptation

Follow the prompts on your screen to improve recognition of spoken words. Adaptation takes about sixty seconds and requires you to be in a quiet place (no background noise).

#### voice recognition settings

#### **Prompts**

**Mode**—Set whether your phone says **Prompts**, **Readout** (to read every word on the screen), or **Tones Only**.

Audio Playback—Set how you want to hear prompts: Automatic detection, Speakerphone, or through your Earpiece.

#### **Call Alert**

For an incoming call, set whether you hear a Ring Only, Caller ID + Ring, or Name Repeat (repeat the name until you answer or the call goes to voicemail).

To access in-device help for a setting you speak, press the Left Soft Key ( $\bigcirc$ ) (Info).

# This model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR

level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. - Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when your car is not moving or before pulling into traffic. If you must make a call while moving, dial only a few numbers, check the road and your mirrors. then continue.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may be distracting. Make people you are talking with aware you are driving and suspend conversations that can divert your attention away from the road.
- Use your mobile device to call for help. Dial 911 or other local emergency number in the case of fire, traffic accident, or medical emergencies.\*

- Use your mobile device to help others in emergencies. If you see an auto accident, crime in progress, or other serious emergency where lives are in danger, call 911 or other local emergency number, as you would want others to do for you.\*
- Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless assistance number when necessary. If you see a broken-down vehicle posing no serious hazard, a broken traffic signal, a minor traffic accident where no one appears injured, or a vehicle you know to be stolen, call roadside assistance or other special non-emergency wireless number.\*
