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Getting Started

Learn about your mobile device hardware, assembly procedures, and how to get started using your new device.

Front View



- 1. Earpiece: Listen to a call.
- Front camera: Take self-portraits and record videos of yourself.
- 3. Iris recognition camera: Scan your iris as a security feature. For more information, see "Irises" on page 188.
- 4. **Back**: Return to the previous screen, or close a dialog box, menu, or keyboard.
- S Pen: Access a variety of powerful functions on your device with the versatile S Pen™.

- Home key/Finger scanner: Return to the Home screen. Activate the Fingerprint security feature.
- Recent: Tap to display recent apps, or touch and hold for Multi window™.
- Status light: Display a light when the battery is charging or fully charged, when a notification arrives, or when recording voice.
- Iris recognition LED: Illuminate your eyes for the Iris scanner.
- 10. Proximity sensors: Detect the presence of objects near the device.

Back View



- 1. SIM card/Memory card tray: Install the SIM card and an optional memory card (not included) for storage of files.
- 2. Flash: Illuminate subjects in low-light environments when taking a photo or recording video.
- 3. Volume keys: Adjust the volume of your device's sounds and audio playback.
- 4. Heart rate sensor: Measure your heart rate using your fingertip when using the S Health™ app. For more information, see "S Health" on page 119.
- 5. **Headset jack**: Connect an optional headset.

- 6. USB charger/Accessory port: Connect the USB charger (included) and other optional accessories (not included).
- 7. **Microphone**: Record audio and detect voice commands
- 8. **Speaker**: Play music and other sounds.
- 9. Power key: Press and hold to turn the device on or off. restart it, or for quick access to Emergency mode. Press to lock or wake up the screen.
- 10. Rear camera: Take pictures and record videos.

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Assemble Your Device

This section helps you to assemble your device.

Install the SIM Card and a Memory Card

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you are provided with a plug-in SIM card. During activation, your SIM card is loaded with your subscription details, such as your Personal Identification Number (PIN), available optional services, and other features.

Warning: Please be careful when handling the SIM card to avoid damaging it. Keep all SIM cards out of reach of small children.

You can also install an optional microSD $^{\mathbb{M}}$, microSDHC $^{\mathbb{M}}$, or microSDXC $^{\mathbb{M}}$ memory card (not included) to add more memory space to your device.

Note: A memory card can be installed at any time. It is not necessary to install it prior to using the device.

Caution: Exercise care when using the removal tool to eject the internal SIM card/Memory card tray.

 Insert the removal tool into the hole on the SIM card/Memory card tray, and then push until the tray pops out.



- 2. Place the SIM card on the tray.
 - Make sure that the card's gold contacts face down into the device and that the card is positioned as shown.

Place the memory card on the tray with the gold contacts facing down.



 Slide the SIM card/Memory card tray back into the slot.

Note: To maintain the water-resistant and dust-resistant features of your device, make sure that the SIM card/Memory card tray and opening are both maintained free of dust and water, and the tray is securely inserted prior to any exposure to liquids.

Caution: If the SIM card or the memory card is not inserted correctly, the device cannot detect it. Reorient the SIM card or memory card and place it back into the slot if it is not detected.

Maintaining Water and Dust Resistance

This device is rated IP68 using the Ingress Protection rating system.

Your device has been tested in a controlled environment and shown to be water and dust resistant in certain circumstances (meets requirements of classification IP68 as described by the international standard IEC 60529 - Degrees of Protection provided by Enclosures [IP Code]; test conditions: 15-35°C, 86-106 kPa, 5.0 feet, for 30 minutes). Despite this classification, your device is not impervious to water damage in any situation. It is important that all compartments are closed tightly.

Note: If any liquid is found to have entered your device components or an internally sealed system, this condition will void your device warranty.

Follow these tips carefully to prevent damage to the device.

- Any device which uses accessible compartments or ports that can be opened should have these sealed or closed tightly to prevent liquid from entering the system.
- Whenever your device gets wet, dry it thoroughly with a clean, soft cloth.
- Do not expose the device to salt water or ionized water, or to water over 5.0 feet deep for more than 30 minutes. If your device is exposed to fresh water, dry it thoroughly with a clean, soft cloth. If the device is exposed to any liquid other than fresh water, rinse the device with fresh water immediately and dry it thoroughly with a clean, soft cloth. Failure to rinse the device in fresh water and dry it as instructed may cause the device to suffer from operability or cosmetic issues.

- Do not expose the device to water at high pressure.
- If the device is dropped or receives an impact, the water and dust resistant features of the device may be damaged.
- The touchscreen and other features may not work properly if the device is used in water or in other liquids. [071516]

Charge the Battery

Your device is powered by a rechargeable, standard Li-Ion battery. A USB charger (charging head and USB cable) is included with the device, for charging the battery from any standard outlet.

The battery comes partially charged. You can use the device while charging.

Note: It is recommended you fully charge the battery before using your device for the first time.

Note: For fastest charging times, use the Samsung Adaptive Fast Charger that came with your device. This charger provides faster charging only when connected to devices that support Adaptive Fast Charging.

Caution: Use only charging devices and batteries that are approved by Samsung. Samsung accessories are designed for your device to maximize battery life. Using other accessories may invalidate your warranty and may cause damage.

 Insert the USB cable into the USB charger/ Accessory port.



Getting Started 7 Assemble Your Device

- Connect the USB cable to the charging head, and then plug the charging head into a standard outlet.
- Unplug the charging head from the outlet and remove the USB cable from the device when charging is complete.

Note: This device is also compatible with wireless charging devices approved by Samsung, which are sold separately.

When to Charge the Battery

When the battery is low and only a few minutes of operation remain, the device sounds a warning tone at regular intervals.

In this condition, your device conserves its remaining battery power by dimming the screen.

When the battery level becomes too low, the device automatically turns off.

For a quick check of your battery level:


 View the battery charge indicator located in the top right corner of your device's display. A solid color () indicates a full charge.

You can also choose to display a percentage value. Viewing a percentage value can provide a better idea of the remaining charge on the battery. For more information, see "Battery" on page 176.

Micro-USB Connector

You can use the included Micro-USB connector to connect a Micro-USB cable (such as from your old device) to your new device for charging with the charging head, or for connecting to a computer.

Note: The Micro-USB connector does not support On-the-Go (OTG) devices such as memory sticks, external hard drives, or keyboard and mouse accessories.



Reverse Charging

The included USB connector allows you to charge another device through a USB cable. When connected, your battery is used to charge the other device, and Charging appears on your device.

You can also use the USB connector for transferring contacts, photos, and other content from an old device. For more information, see "Smart Switch" on page 11.

Set Up Your Device

Turn Your Device On or Off

The instructions below explain how to turn your device on or off.

Turn the Device On

To turn the device on:

 Press and hold the Power key until the device turns on.

Turn the Device Off

To turn the device off:

- Press and hold the **Power** key until the Device options menu is displayed.
- 2. Tap **Power off**, and confirm if prompted.

Restart the Device

If your device stops responding to taps or finger gestures and you are unable to turn it off, you can restart your device.

 Press and hold the Power key and the Volume down key at the same time for more than seven seconds.

Initial Set Up


The first time you turn your device on, a Welcome screen is displayed. It guides you through the basics of setting up your device.

Follow the prompts to choose a default language, connect to a Wi-Fi® network, set up accounts, choose location services, learn about your device's features, and more.

Note: Accessibility options can be configured by tapping **Accessibility**. For more information, see "Accessibility" on page 209.

Smart Switch

Use Smart Switch™ to transfer contacts, photos, and other content from your old device. You can also use the included USB connector to copy content quickly and easily from your old device, without installing the Smart Switch app.



Note: The USB option must be set to Media device (MTP) on the other device. Transferring content with a USB cable may increase battery consumption. Make sure your battery is fully charged. The USB connector does not charge the battery.

- 1. Select **Smart Switch** during setup.
 - or -

From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > Settings > Backup and reset > Open Smart Switch.

2. Follow the prompts and select the content to transfer

Secure Your Device

Use your device's screen lock features to secure your device.

Lock the Device

By default, the device locks automatically when the screen times out.

To lock the device:

► Press the **Power** key.

Unlock the Device

The default Screen lock on your device is Swipe.

Note: To choose a more secure screen lock, see <u>"Set a Screen Lock" on page 185</u>.

To unlock the device:

Press the Power key or Home key, and then drag your finger across the screen.

Set Up Accounts on Your Device

Samsung Account

Create a Samsung account for access to Samsung content and apps on your device. When you turn on your device for the first time, set up your existing Samsung account or create a new Samsung account.

- or -

To create a new Samsung account or set up your Samsung account on your device at any time, use Accounts settings. For more information, see <u>"Accounts"</u> on page 198.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🏢 Apps > 📀 Settings.
- Tap Accounts > + Add account > Samsung account.

Google Account

Your new device uses your Google™ Account to fully utilize its Android™ features, including Gmail™, Google Hangouts™, and the Google Play™ store.

When you turn on your device for the first time, set up your existing Google Account or create a new Google Account.

- or -

To create a new Google Account or set up your Google Account on your device at any time, use Accounts settings. For more information, see "Accounts" on page 198.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🔠 Apps > 📀 Settings.
- 2. Tap Accounts > + Add account > Google.

Factory Reset Protection

When you sign in to a Google Account on your device, Factory Reset Protection is turned on. Factory Reset Protection (FRP) prevents other people from using your device if it is reset to factory settings without your permission. For example, if your device is lost or stolen and a factory data reset is performed, only someone with your Google Account username and password can use the device.

You will not be able to access the device after a factory data reset if you do not have your Google Account username and password. For more information, see "Factory Data Reset" on page 206.

Caution: You should remove your Google Account before shipping your device to Samsung or any other service provider for service and before resetting the device to factory settings.

Enable Factory Reset Protection

Adding a Google Account to your device automatically turns on the Factory Reset Protection (FRP) security feature. For more information, see google.com.

Disable Factory Reset Protection

To disable FRP, remove all Google Accounts from the device.

- From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **♦ Settings**.
- 2. Tap Accounts > Google.
 - If you have more than one Google Account set up on your device, tap the Google Account you want to remove.
- Tap More options > Remove account. Confirm when prompted.

Know Your Device

Learn some of the key features of your mobile device, including the screens and icons, as well as how to navigate the device and enter text using the keyboard.

Warning: Please note that a touch screen responds best to a light touch from the pad of your finger or a capacitive stylus. Using excessive force or a metallic object when pressing on the touch screen may damage the tempered glass surface and void the warranty.

Home Screen



- Status bar: Displays device status icons (right) and notification icons (left).
 For more information, see "Status Bar" on page 21.
- 2. **Edge screen handle**: Reveals the Edge screen.
- 3. **App folder**: Groups multiple apps into a folder.
- Apps list: Allows quick access to all of your applications.
- Primary app shortcuts: Displays these shortcuts on all Home screens.

- 6. Home screen indicator: Indicates which Home screen is currently visible
- App shortcuts: Launches your favorite applications.
- Widget: Runs as a simple application extension (not a shortcut) on a Home screen.

Customize the Home Screen

Customize your Home screens by adding application shortcuts, widgets, and folders, and using wallpapers.

To access Home screen manager:

- ► From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
 - or –

Touch and hold an empty space on the screen.

Manage Home Screens

Your device comes with multiple Home screens to hold app shortcuts and widgets. You can add, remove, change the order of screens, as well as choose a different main Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Use these options to manage screens:

- Add a screen: Swipe to the end of the screens, and then tap — Add.
- Remove a screen: Touch and hold a screen, and then drag it to Delete.
- Set a screen as the main Home screen: Tap
 Main Home screen at the top of a screen.

 This screen is displayed when you press the Home key.
- Change the order of screens: Touch and hold a screen, and then drag it to a new position.
- Flipboard Briefing: Swipe to the left of the screens to find the Flipboard Briefing screen.
 To enable or disable this feature, tap On/Off at the top of the screen.

Wallpapers and Themes

Set visual themes for all system screens and icons on your device. Change the look of the Home and Lock screens with wallpaper. You can display a favorite picture or choose from preloaded wallpapers.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Tap **Wallpapers and themes** to customize.

Widgets

Widgets are simple application extensions that run on a Home screen. There are many kinds of widgets, including links to a specific contact, Internet bookmarks, Gmail and email accounts, and many others.

Add a Widget to a Home Screen

You can add a widget to a Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- Tap Widgets.
- Touch and hold a widget, drag it to a Home screen, and release it.

Remove a Widget

You can remove a widget that you added to a Home screen.

- From a Home screen, touch and hold a widget to release it.
- 2. Drag the widget to **TREMOVE** and release it.

Note: Removing a widget does not delete the widget, it just removes the widget from the Home screen.

Screen Grid

Change the number of icons that can be placed on each Home screen by changing the Screen grid dimensions.

- 1. From a Home screen, pinch the screen.
- 2. Tap Screen grid.
- Tap a dimension option (4 x 4, 4 x 5, or 5 x 5) to preview its appearance. The numbers indicate how many icons can be placed horizontally by how many icons can be placed vertically.
- 4. Tap Apply to apply the selected dimensions.

App Shortcuts

You can use app shortcuts to launch an app from any Home screen.

Add a Shortcut to a Home Screen

You can add a shortcut to a Home screen.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps.
- 2. Touch and hold an app shortcut, drag it to a Home screen, and then release it.

Remove a Shortcut

You can remove a shortcut that you added to a Home screen.

- 1. Touch and hold an app shortcut to release it.
- 2. Drag the app shortcut to **m Remove** and release it.

Note: Removing a shortcut does not delete the app, it just removes the shortcut from the Home screen.

Move a Shortcut

You can move a shortcut from one Home screen to another.

- 1. Touch and hold an app shortcut to release it.
- 2. Drag the app shortcut to Move apps and release it.
- 3. Swipe to a new Home screen.
- Tap the shortcut to place it in the next available location, or drag it to a specific location and release it.

Folders

Place folders on a Home screen to organize items.

Create a Folder

You can create an app folder on a Home screen.

- From a Home screen, touch and hold an app shortcut and drag it on top of another app shortcut until a highlighted box appears.
- 2. Release the app shortcut to create the folder.
 - Enter folder name: Enter a name for the folder.
 - Palette: Change the color.
 - Add: Place more apps in the folder. Tap apps to select them, and then tap Add.
- 3. Tap anywhere outside of the folder to close it.
 - To add more apps, touch and hold an app shortcut and drag it to the folder.

Remove a Folder from a Home Screen

You can remove a folder that you added to a Home screen.


- 1. Touch and hold the folder until it detaches.
- Drag the folder to **Remove** and release it. Confirm when prompted.

Status Bar

The Status bar at the top of the Home screen provides device information (such as network status, battery charge, and time) on the right side and notification alerts on the left.

Navigation

Learn the basics for how to navigate through your device.

Touchscreen Navigation

Use the following motions and gestures on your touchscreen to navigate the device.

Tap

Lightly tap items to select or launch them.

- Tap the keyboard to enter characters or text.
- Tap an item to select it.
- Tap an app shortcut to launch the application.

Touch and Hold

Touch and hold items on the screen to activate them.

- Touch and hold a widget on a Home screen to move it.
- Touch and hold a field to display a pop-up menu of options.

Swipe

Lightly drag your finger vertically or horizontally across the screen.

- Swipe the screen to unlock the device.
- Swipe the screen to scroll through the Home screens or menu options.

Drag

Touch and hold an item, and then move it to a new location.

- Drag an app shortcut to add it to a Home screen.
- Drag a widget to place it in a new location on a Home screen.

Pinch and Spread

Pinch the screen using your thumb and forefinger or spread by moving your fingers apart.

- Pinch the screen to zoom out while viewing a picture or a web page.
- Spread your fingers on the screen to zoom in while viewing a picture or a web page.

Common Options

The device uses basic command options to perform common actions.

- More options: Tap to view more menu options for a screen. This often allows you to select items to delete or share
- Delete: Tap to select items to delete.
- Share: Tap to select items to share, and then choose a sharing method.
- **Edit**: Tap to customize the screen.
- On/Off: Tap to turn the option on () or off ().
- Checkbox: Tap to enable or select. When enabled, a checkmark is displayed. You can often tap a checkbox at the top of the screen to select all.
- Menu: Tap to view available options for the field.

Notification Panel



- 1. **Settings**: Display the Settings screen.
- View all: See all available Quick settings, adjust screen brightness, and more.
- Clear notifications: Clear all notifications.
- Notification settings: Enable or disable notifications from each app. For more information, see "Notifications" on page 155.

- Notification card: View details about a notification.
- 6. **Quick settings**: Quickly enable or disable a feature.

View the Notification Panel

You can access the Notification panel from any Home screen.

- Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel.
- 2. Swipe down the list to see notification details.
 - To open an item, tap it.
 - To clear a single notification, drag the notification left or right.
 - To clear all notifications, tap Clear.
- Drag upward from the bottom of the screen or tap
 Back to close the Notification panel.

Quick Settings

In addition to notifications, the Notification panel also provides quick access to device functions such as Wi-Fi, allowing you to quickly turn them on or off.

To view additional Quick settings and customize the Quick settings that display:

- Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel.
- 2. Drag == View all downward.
- 3. Tap a setting to turn it on or off.
- Touch and hold a setting to edit the quick settings panel.
- 5. Tap **Done** when finished.

Multi Window

Multitask by using multiple applications at the same time.



Window Controls

Tap Window controls in the middle of the window border.



Switch windows: Switch locations between Multi window apps.



Drag and drop content: Move items between the app windows. Drag an item to share from one window to another. Not all

applications support this feature.



Minimize window: Minimize the selected app window. This turns the app into a circular, movable icon that can be opened by tapping on it.



Maximize window: Open the selected app window in full screen view.



Close app: Close the selected app.

Activate Multi Window

Apps that support Multi window display together on a split screen. You can switch between the apps, adjust the size of their display on the screen, and copy information from one app to the other.

Note: Multi window is not available for all apps.

- From any screen, touch and hold Recent.
- 2. Tap two apps that support Multi window to open them in split screen view.

- or -

If you are currently using an app that supports Multi window, tap another app to add it in split screen view.

You can also launch recently used apps directly into Multi window view:

- 1. Tap 🗂 **Recent**.
 - Recently used apps that support Multi window have a Multi window icon in their title bar.
- Tap Multi window in the title bar to launch an application in split screen view.
 - Other recently used apps that support Multi window display below the launched app.
- 3. Tap an app icon to add it to the split screen view.

Note: Only applications that support Multi window have the Multi window icon.

Edge Screen

The Edge screen provides a variety of useful tools for notifications, information feeds, and timekeeping.

Edge Panels

Edge panels can be used to access apps, tasks, and contacts, as well as view news, sports, and other information on the Edge screen.

To view Edge panels:

When the screen is turned on, swipe the Edge panel handle from the edge of the screen to the center. Keep swiping to view other panels.

To configure Edge panels:

From any screen, open the Edge screen, and then tap Edge panel settings.

For more information, see "Edge Panels" on page 166.

Apps Edge

You can add up to ten apps in two columns to the Apps edge panel.

To view Apps edge:

When the screen is turned on, swipe the Edge panel handle from the edge of the screen to the center. Keep swiping until the Apps edge panel is displayed.

To configure Apps edge:

- 1. From any screen, open the Edge screen, and swipe until the Apps edge panel is displayed.
- Tap Add application to add other apps to the Apps edge.
 - To add an app to the Apps edge, find it on the left side of the screen and tap it to add it to an available space on a column on the right.
 - To change the order of the apps on the Edge panel, drag each app to the desired location.
 - To remove an app, tap **Delete**.
- Tap Back to save changes.

People Edge

People edge allows you to set the Edge screen to light up with distinct colors when you receive notifications about contacts in your My people list. You can also use this panel to quickly communicate with contacts in your My people list.

To view People edge:

When the screen is turned on, swipe the Edge panel handle from the edge of the screen to the center. Keep swiping until the People edge panel is displayed.

To configure People edge:

- From any screen, open the Edge screen, swipe until the People edge panel is displayed.
- Tap Add contact to add other contacts to the People edge.
 - To remove a contact, touch and hold the contact and then drag it to **TREMOVE**.
 - To change the order of the contacts on the Edge panel, drag each contact to the desired location.
- Tap OnCircle to communicate with your friends using images, stickers, and other fun messages.
- 4. Tap **Back** to save changes.

Tasks Edge

You can add shortcuts to common tasks performed with stock apps to the Tasks edge panel. Up to ten tasks in two columns can be added.

To view Tasks edge:

When the screen is turned on, swipe the Edge panel handle from the edge of the screen to the center. Keep swiping until the Tasks edge panel is displayed.

To configure Tasks edge:

- From any screen, open the Edge screen, swipe until the Tasks edge panel is displayed.
- 2. Tap Add shortcut to add other tasks to the Tasks edge.
 - To add a shortcut to the Tasks edge, find it on the left side of the screen and drag it on to an available space on a column on the right.

- To change the order of the tasks on the Edge panel, drag each task to the desired location.
- To remove a task, tap **Delete**.
- 3. Tap **Back** to save changes.

Edge Feeds

Edge feeds display select information and notifications on the Edge screen when the screen is turned off.

To view Edge feeds:

When the screen is turned off, quickly swipe your finger along the Edge screen in one direction, and then back in the opposite direction.

For more information, see "Edge Feeds" on page 166.

Edge Lighting

You can set the Edge screen to light up when you receive calls or notifications while the device is turned over.

For more information, see "Edge Lighting" on page 167.

S Pen

The S Pen is a stylus that assists you in performing various functions.



Note: To maintain the water-resistant and dust-resistant features of your device, make sure that the S Pen slot and opening are both maintained free of dust and water, and the pen is securely inserted prior to any exposure to liquids.

Remove S Pen

The S Pen stores inside your device for convenient access.

- 1. Push the S Pen inward until it pops out of the device.
- 2. Slide the S Pen out the rest of the way using the notch on the end of the S Pen.



Air View

Hover the S Pen over the screen to preview content, or view information about an item on the screen. For example:

- Hover over an email in a list to preview the message before opening it.
- Hover over a photo album to preview the contents or see a picture enlarged.
- Hover over the timeline during video playback to preview and navigate to specific scenes.
- Hover over an icon or screen button to view the item's name or description.

Note: The preview function is only available when the S Pen's onscreen pointer is a solid color.

Direct Pen Input

When filling out a form field in an app (like Name or Phone number in Contacts), you can open a Handwriting window to allow you to write an entry with the S Pen rather than type.

To use the Handwriting window:

- When filling out a form field, hover the S Pen over the field until the Handwriting icon appears.
- Tap Handwriting. The Handwriting window appears.
- Use the space provided in the window to write an entry by hand using the S Pen. While writing, your entries are converted into text.
 - To edit the converted text, use the Space, Delete, and Enter icons. To change the position of the cursor, drag the pointer below the cursor to the desired position for editing.

Screen Off Memo

You can write quick memos without turning your device on.

Note: The screen off memo setting must be enabled. For more information, see <u>"S Pen Settings" on page 169</u>.

To create a screen off memo:

- 1. Detach the S Pen while the screen is off.
- 2. Write on the screen.
 - Tap Save to save your memo to the Samsung Notes app.
 - Tap **Delete** to discard the memo.

Configure S Pen Settings

You can configure settings for the S Pen, including options for sounds and for tracking the S Pen when it is not stored in your device.

To configure S Pen settings:



Replace the S Pen Tip



To replace the tip:

Air Command

Smart Select

The Smart select feature provides a capture tool to select content on a screen. You can then add it to your Gallery app or share it with your contacts.

- Tap a shape at the top of the screen, and then drag a box with the S Pen to select content. The following options appear:
 - Auto select: Allow Smart select to automatically select content to extract.
 - Extract text: Identify and extract text from the selected content.
 - Draw: Draw on the captured screen using the S Pen.
 - Share: Choose a sharing method to share your content.
 - Save: Save the content to the Gallery app.

Screen Write

Screen write allows you to capture a screen shot and then write notes on the screen shot.

To use Screen write:

- Tap Air command > Screen write.
- The current screen is captured, and a pen tool appears. The following editing tools are provided:
 - Pen: Draw on the screen shot. Press the Pen icon a second time to change the pen tip, size, color, and to save presets.
 - Eraser: Erase the writing or drawings on the screen shot. Tap the Eraser icon a second time to change the size of the eraser area and to see the Erase all option.
 - Undo: Undo the last action.
 - Redo: Redo the last action that was undone.

- Scroll capture: Capture any scrollable areas of the screen that are hidden.
- **Crop**: Crop the captured screen.
- Share: Choose a sharing method to share your content.
- Save: Save the content to the Gallery app.
- 3. Tap **Save** when finished.

Translate

Translate words by hovering over them with the S Pen.

To access Translate:

- Tap Air command > (a) Translate.
- 2. Tap the Source and Target languages to change them to the desired languages.
- 3. Hover the S Pen over a word.
 - Tap Sound to hear the word pronounced in the Source language.
- 4. Tap X Close to close Translate.

Add Shortcuts

You can add shortcuts to apps and functions to the Air command menu.

To use Add shortcuts:

- Tap Air command > Add shortcuts.
- Swipe across the screens, and tap the apps or functions you would like to add to the Air command menu.
 - To delete an app shortcut tap **Remove**.
- 3. Tap **Sack** to save your selection.

Air Command Settings

Configure settings for Air command.

To access Settings:

- ► Tap Air command > Settings. The following options are available:
 - **Shortcuts**: Choose and arrange the shortcuts that appear on the Air command menu.
 - Floating icon: Choose to enable the

Enter Text

Text can be entered using a keyboard or by speaking.

Use the Samsung Keyboard

Enter text using a QWERTY keyboard.



Special Keys

Sym Symbol: Tap to insert symbols.

Touch and hold **Options** for the following:



Voice input: Enter text using Samsung voice input.



Handwriting: Use your handwriting to enter text.



Clipboard: Access the clipboard.



Emoticon: Insert an emoticon at the cursor position.



Keyboard settings: Access keyboard settings.

Predictive Text

Emergency Mode

Emergency mode conserves your device's remaining power when you are in an emergency situation.

Emergency mode saves battery power by:

- Restricting application usage to only essential applications and those you select.
- Turning off Mobile data when the screen is off.
- Turning off connectivity features such as Wi-Fi and Bluetooth®.

Note: When Emergency mode is turned off, the Location settings may stay the same as they were in Emergency mode.

Activate Emergency Mode

To activate Emergency mode:

- Press and hold the **Power** key to display the Device options window.
- 2. Tap Emergency mode.
- 3. Tap **Turn on**.

Turn Off Emergency Mode

From the Emergency mode Home screen, tapMore options > Turn off Emergency mode.

Use Emergency Mode

While in Emergency mode, your device conserves power. The following apps and features are available on the Home screen:

- Flashlight: Use the device's flash as a steady source of light.
- Emergency alarm: Sound an audible siren.
- Message my location: Send your location information to your emergency contacts.
- Phone: Launch the call screen.
- Emergency alerts: Receive geographically-targeted messages.


- 🛨 Add: Add other available apps.
 - Chrome: Browse the internet with Google Chrome™.
 - Maps: Launch Google Maps[™].
- Battery charge: Display estimated battery charge remaining.
- Estimated usage time remaining: Display estimated standby time that can be reached based on current battery charge and usage.
- Emergency call: Dial the emergency telephone number (for example, 911). This kind of call can be made even without activated cellular service.

- More options:
 - Turn off Emergency mode: Disable Emergency mode and return to standard mode.
 - Remove: Choose apps to remove from the screen.
 - Manage emergency contacts: Manage your medical profile and ICE (In Case of Emergency) group contacts.
 - Settings: Configure the available settings.
 Only a limited number of settings are enabled in Emergency mode.

Calling

Make telephone calls using a variety of calling features and services.

Phone Screen



- More options: Access Speed dial and Call settings.
- Hide the keypad: Hide the keypad and display recent calls.
- 3. Video call: Make video calls.
- 4. Call: Make a call.
- 5. **Voice command**: Say the number you want to dial.
- 6. **Keypad**: Dial the number that you want to call.

- 7. **Voicemail**: Set up and check your voicemail. For more information, see <u>"Set Up and Access Voicemail" on page 62</u>.
- Tabs: Display a log of all dialed, received, and missed calls. Display your contacts and select a contact to call.

Access Phone

From a Home screen, tap ***** Apps > ** Phone**.

Display Your Phone Number

Your phone number can be found in Settings.

- ► From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Settings > About phone > Status.
 - Your phone number is displayed in the My phone number field.

Call Settings

- From a Home screen, tap Phone >More options > Settings.
 - or –

From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **Settings** > **Applications** > **Phone**.

Make and Answer Calls

Learn how to make or answer a call. Explore features and functionality associated with making or answering a call.

Make a Call

You can make a call from a Home screen.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🕓 Phone.
- 2. Enter a number on the keypad and tap either Call or Video call.
 - Tap (1) Keypad if the keypad is not displayed.

Note: Video calling requires that all parties be on the same carrier and use devices that support the video calling feature. Check with your carrier for all requirements.

Dial a Number from Your Contacts List

You can quickly dial a phone number from your Contacts list.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **△ Contacts**.
 - or –

From a Home screen, tap **S** Phone > Contacts.

Swipe your finger across a contact to the right to call the contact.

Dial a Recent Number

All incoming, outgoing, and missed calls are recorded in the Call log. If the number or caller is listed in your contacts list, the associated name is also displayed.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🕓 Phone.
- 2. Tap **Recent**. A list of recent calls is displayed.
- Tap a contact, and then tap \(\mathbb{C} \) Call.

Video Calls

To activate Video calling:

- From a Home screen, tap Phone >
 More options > Settings.
- 2. Tap Video calling to enable.

To make Video calls:

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🕓 Phone.
- 2. Enter a number and tap Video call.

Note: Not all devices support Video calling. The receiver has the option to accept the video call or answer the call as a regular voice call.

To switch from a Phone call to a Video call after dialing:

- ► Tap Camera to request two-way video calling.
 - or –

Tap One-way camera to only send video of yourself to your recipient.

Answer a Call

When a call is received, the phone rings and the caller's phone number or name is displayed, if it is stored in the Contacts list.

- ► At the incoming call screen:
 - Drag **\Circle{O}** Answer to the right to answer the call.
 - Drag Video answer to the right to answer the call as a video call.
 - Drag Reject to the left to reject the call and send it to your voicemail.
 - Drag Send message upward and select a message.

If you are using an app, a pop-up screen is displayed for the incoming call.

- ► On the incoming call pop-up screen:
 - Tap Answer to answer the call.
 - Tap Reject to reject the call and send it to your voicemail.
 - Tap **Send message** and select a message.

End a Call

To finish your call:

Tap C End when you are ready to end your call.

Multitask While on a Call

If you exit the call screen and return to a Home screen, your active call is indicated by **Call** on the Status bar.

This lets you continue with your current call and do something else, such as access the contacts list, view a recent email, or locate a picture.

To return to the call screen:

 Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel, and then tap Call notification.

To end a call from any application:

 Drag the Status bar down to display the Notification panel, and then tap End call.

Options During a Call

Your phone provides several options that you can use during a call.

Adjust the Call Volume

 Press the Volume keys to increase or decrease the volume.

- or -

Tap More options > Turn on extra volume to quickly add more volume to the incoming audio.

Listen with the Speaker or Bluetooth Headset

Listen to the call using the speaker or through a Bluetooth headset (not included).

► Tap (1) **Speaker** to hear the caller using the speaker.

- or -

Tap **Bluetooth** to hear the caller using a Bluetooth headset.

Place a New Call While on a Call

If your service plan supports this feature, you can make another call while a call is in progress.

- From the active call, tap Add call to dial the second call.
- Dial the new number and tap Call. When the call is answered:
 - Tap **On hold** to switch between the two calls.
 - Tap Merge to hear both callers at once (multi-conferencing).

Call Waiting

If your service plan supports this feature, you can answer an incoming call while you have a call in progress. You are notified of an incoming call by a call waiting tone.

To answer a new call while you have a call in progress:

- 2. Tap the previous **On hold number entry** to switch between the two calls. This places the new caller on hold and activates the previous call.

Video Call Options

The following camera options are available during a video call:

- Camera: Turn your camera on or off.
 - The option depends on whether your camera is currently on or off.
- **Switch**: Switch between the rear and front cameras.

Call Log

The numbers of the calls you have dialed, received, or missed are stored in the Call log.

- From a Home screen, tap Phone.
- Tap Recent. A list of recent calls is displayed. If the caller is in your Contacts list, the caller's name is displayed.

Save a Recent Call to Your Contacts List

Use recent call information to create a contact or update your Contacts list.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🕓 Phone > Recent.
- 2. Tap the call that contains the information that you want to save to your Contacts list.
- 3. Tap Details.
- 4. Tap Create contact.
 - or –

If you want to replace the number for an existing contact, tap **Update existing**.

Delete a Call from the Call Log

To delete Call log entries:

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 💽 Phone > Recent.
- Touch and hold the call you want to delete from the Call log.
- Tap Delete.

Block a Number

By adding a caller to your Block list, future calls from this number are sent directly to your voicemail, and messages are not received.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **OPhone** > **Recent**.
- Tap the caller you want to add to the Block list.
- Tap Details > More options > Block number.
 Confirm when prompted.

You can also modify the Block list in Settings:

From a Home screen, tap Phone >
 More options > Settings > Block numbers.

Speed Dial

You can assign a shortcut number to a contact for speed dialing their default number.

Create a Speed Dial

You can assign 999 speed dial numbers.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🕓 **Phone**.
 - Tap (1) Keypad if the keypad is not displayed.
- Tap More options > Speed dial. The Speed dial screen displays the reserved speed dial numbers.
 - Tap Menu to select a different Speed dial number than the next one in sequence.
 - Number 1 is reserved for Voicemail.

- 3. Tap an unassigned number.
- Type in a name or number, or tap Add from Contacts to assign a contact to the number.
 - The selected contact is displayed in the Speed dial number box.

Use Speed Dial to Make a Call

You can make a call using Speed dial.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🔇 Phone.
 - Tap Keypad if the keypad is not displayed.
- 2. Touch and hold the Speed dial number.
 - If the Speed dial number is more than one digit long, enter the first digits, and then hold the last digit.

Remove a Speed Dial Number Assignment

You can remove an assigned Speed dial number.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🕓 Phone.
- Tap More options > Speed dial.
- Find the contact to remove from Speed dial.
- Tap Remove.

Emergency Calls

You can dial the emergency telephone number in your region regardless of the phone's cellular service status.

Make an Emergency Call

You can dial the emergency telephone number from your phone whether or not cellular service has been activated. If your phone is not activated, you can only make an emergency call.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🕓 **Phone**.
- Enter the emergency telephone number (911 in North America) and tap Call.
- 3. Complete your call. During this type of call, you have access to most in-call features.

Call Emergency Services from a Locked Screen

The emergency telephone number can be dialed even if the phone is locked, allowing anyone to use your phone to call for help in an emergency. When accessed from a locked screen, only the emergency calling feature is accessible to the caller. The rest of the phone remains secured.

Swipe Lock Screen

If the Lock screen is set to Swipe, you can access the call screen in a couple of ways.

- Drag Phone upward to open the call screen.
 - or -

Swipe across the screen to unlock it, and then tap **Phone**.

- 2. Enter the emergency telephone number (911 in North America) and tap Call.
- 3. Complete your call. During this type of call, you have access to most in-call features.

Secure Lock Screens

You can make calls even if your phone has a secure lock screen.

- 1. Drag **OPhone** upward to open the call screen.
- Tap Emergency call to display the Emergency dialer.
- 3. Enter the emergency telephone number (911 in North America) and tap Call.
- 4. Complete your call. During this type of call, you have access to most in-call features.

Set Up and Access Voicemail

Set up and configure your voicemail.

Set Up Your Voicemail

You can access your voicemail from a Home screen.

- From the Home screen, tap Apps >
 Voice Mail.
- Follow the tutorial to create a password, record a greeting, and record your name.

Note: These steps may be different depending on your network.

Access Your Voicemail

You can access your voicemail from a Home screen.

- From the Home screen, tap Apps > Oice Mail.
 - You may be prompted to enter a password.
- 2. Follow the voice prompts from the voicemail center.

Access Your Voicemail from Another Phone

You can access your voicemail from another phone.

- From another phone, dial your wireless phone number. Wait until you hear your voicemail greeting.
- Press the asterisk or star (*) key on the phone you are using.
- Enter your password and you are connected to your voicemail.

Applications

 Play Store: Download new apps from the Google Play store. Visit <u>play.google.com/store/apps</u> to learn more

Uninstall or Disable Apps

You can uninstall or disable apps you download and install.

- Preloaded apps cannot be uninstalled.
- Apps that are disabled are turned off and hidden from view.

To uninstall or disable an app:

- Tap More options > Edit. Apps that can be uninstalled or disabled display Uninstall/disable on their shortcut.
- 3. Tap Uninstall/disable and follow the prompts to either uninstall or disable the app.
- 4. Tap **Done** when finished.

To enable apps after disabling them:

 - Add: Place more apps in the folder. Tap apps to select them, and then tap Add.
- 4. Tap anywhere outside of the folder to close it.
 - To add more apps, touch and hold an app shortcut and drag it to the folder.
- 5. Tap **Done** when finished.

To launch apps in a folder:

► Tap a folder, and then tap an app shortcut to launch it.

To delete a folder:

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > More options > Edit.
- Tap the folder to delete, and then tap Remove folder. Confirm when prompted.
- 3. Tap **Done** when finished.





- 2. Enter the first number using the numeric keys.
- 3. Tap the appropriate arithmetic function key.
- 4. Enter the next number.
- 5. Tap **Equals** to view the result.
- 6. Tap C Clear to clear the results.

Additional Functions

You can perform additional functions on your calculator.

To clear the calculator history:

► Tap History > Clear history.

Tip: Tap Keypad to return to the calculator keys.

To copy all or part of the calculation to the clipboard:

► Touch and hold an entry in the display field, and then tap ☐ Copy.

Scientific Calculator

The Calculator app also provides advanced arithmetic functions, such as *sin*, *cos*, and *tan*.

To use the Scientific calculator:

► If Auto rotate is enabled, turn the device to landscape.

- or -

If Portrait is enabled, tap 🚫 Rotate screen.

Note: Auto rotate and Portrait are found in the Quick settings on the Notification panel. For more information, see "Notification Panel" on page 25.

Calendar

Manage your events and tasks.

Calendar View

To choose a calendar view:

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🗰 Apps > 🔞 Calendar.
- 2. Tap View, and then tap one of the following:
 - Year: Display all twelve months of this year.
 Swipe across the screen to display another year.
 - Month: Display the current month. Swipe across the screen to display another month. Events and tasks are also displayed.
 - Week: Display the current week. Swipe across the screen to display another week.

- Day: Display today's schedule by hour. Swipe across the screen to display another day.
- Tasks: Display all tasks.
- 3. Tap **Today** to return to the current date.

Create an Event

You can use your Calendar to create events.

- . From a Home screen, tap **# Apps >** 8 Calendar.
- 2. Tap + Create event or task to add an event.
- 3. Enter details for the event, and then tap **Save**.

Share an Event

You can share events you create from your Calendar.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **8** Calendar.
- 2. Tap an event to open it.
- Tap Share, choose a sharing method, and follow the prompts.

Delete an Event

You can delete events you create from your Calendar.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **# Apps** > **8** Calendar.
- 2. Tap an event to open it.
- Tap Delete. Confirm when prompted.

Create a Task

You can use your Calendar to create tasks. Tasks are items you add to the calendar to be accomplished on a certain day. A task appears as a checklist item and is removed once you mark the task as complete.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **# Apps > 8 Calendar**.
- 2. Tap View > Tasks.
- Tap the Enter new task field to enter a new task.
- You can choose to set the task for Today, Tomorrow, or tap Set details to set the following options:
 - Set date: Choose a date on the calendar for the task.
 - My tasks: Change the calendar on which the task is saved. You can change the task to an event by tapping My calendars.

- Reminder: Set a reminder alert.
- Notes: Save a note with your task.
- **Priority**: Assign a priority to the task.
- Tap Save to save the task.

Delete a Task

You can delete tasks you create from your Calendar.


- 1. From a Home screen, tap ***** Apps > *** Calendar**.
- Tap a day on the calendar to view the tasks for the day, or tap View > Tasks.
- 3. Tap the Checkbox by the task to mark it as complete and remove it from the calendar.
 - To delete the task permanently, tap the task to open it, and then tap **Delete**. Confirm when prompted.

Calendar Settings

These settings allow you to modify settings associated with using the Calendar.

- I. From a Home screen, tap **# Apps** > 8 Calendar.
- 2. Tap More options > Settings.
- 3. Tap an option and follow the prompts.

Camera and Video



- Beauty: Take a picture with lightened faces for gentler images.
- 2. **Gallery**: Open the Gallery to view photos and videos.
- 3. **Take a picture**: Take a picture.
- 4. Record video: Record a video.
- Camera, Modes, or Effects: Swipe right to change the shooting mode. Swipe left to add an effects filter.

- Switch cameras: Switch between the rear and front cameras.
- HDR: Enables the light sensitivity and color depth features of the device to produce a brighter and richer picture.
- 8. **Flash**: Activate or deactivate the flash.
- 9. **Settings**: Configure other camera settings.

Take Pictures

Take pictures with your device's front or rear camera.

Note: Prior to using the camera, remove the plastic protective covering from the camera lens.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap ****** Apps > O Camera**.
- Using the display screen as a viewfinder, compose your shot by aiming the camera at the subject.
 While composing your picture, use the available options or these gestures:
 - To zoom in or out, touch the screen with two fingers and pinch or spread them on the screen.
 - To focus the shot, tap the screen. When you tap the screen, a brightness scale is displayed.
 Slide the light bulb up or down to adjust the brightness.
 - To add an effects filter, swipe to the left and tap a preview filter to apply it to the screen.

- To add a shooting mode, swipe to the right and select a mode.
- To quickly switch between the front and rear cameras, swipe the screen up or down.
- To add a camera setting, tap a Quick settings icon or Settings along the side of the screen.
- 3. Tap **a** Take a picture to take the picture.

Note: You can also press the **Volume** key up or down to take a picture. This is the default action of the Volume key while the camera is active. You can also set the Volume key to act as the video record key or as a zoom key.

Shooting Mode

Several visual effects are available. Some modes are not available when taking self-portraits.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🔠 Apps > 🌘 Camera.
- Swipe to the right for the Mode options. Each section indicates which camera (front or rear) the modes are available for.

Rear camera

- Auto: Allow the camera to evaluate the surroundings and determine the ideal mode for the picture.
- Pro: Manually adjust the ISO sensitivity, exposure value, white balance, and color tone while taking pictures.
- Panorama: Create a linear image by taking pictures in either a horizontal or vertical direction.

- Selective focus: Change the focus of pictures after they have been taken. You can focus on subjects near to the camera, far away from the camera, or both.
- Slow motion: Record videos at a high frame rate for viewing in slow motion. You can play a specific section of each video in slow motion after recording it.
- Hyperlapse: Create your own time lapse video by recording at various frame rates. The frame rate is automatically adjusted depending on the scene being recorded and the movement of the device.
- Food: Take pictures that emphasize the vivid colors of food.

Front camera

- **Selfie**: Take selfie shots and apply various effects, such as an airbrushed effect.
- Wide selfie: Take wide-angle selfie shots to fit more people into your pictures.

Common

- Virtual shot: Create multi-directional views of objects.
- Video collage: Create your own short collages and slow-motion videos without any editing tools.
- Live broadcast: Broadcast live on YouTube.
 Share your link with friends so they can watch your video in real time. For more information, see "Live Broadcast" on page 85.
- **Download**: Download additional shooting modes from the Galaxy Apps store.
- More options: See more options for the camera modes.

Camera Settings

You can adjust your camera's settings using the icons on the main camera screen and the full camera settings menu.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🔠 Apps > 🌘 Camera.
- Tap Settings to configure settings for the Camera. Available options vary depending on the camera or recording mode used.

Rear camera

- Picture size: Select a resolution. Use higher resolution for higher quality. Higher resolution pictures take up more memory.
- **Video size**: Select a resolution. Use higher resolution for higher quality. Higher resolution videos take up more memory.
- **Tracking AF**: Focus on and track a subject selected on the preview screen.
- Shape correction: Correct distortion in pictures automatically.

Front camera

- Picture size: Select a resolution. Use higher resolution for higher quality. Higher resolution pictures take up more memory.
- Video size: Select a resolution. Use higher resolution for higher quality. Higher resolution videos take up more memory.
- Save pictures as previewed: Save the self-portrait or self-recording as viewed on the camera screen, not as flipped images.
- Ways to take pictures:
 - Tap to take pics: Tap the screen to take selfies.
 - Gesture control: Detect your palm and automatically take a picture two seconds later.
 - Use heart rate sensor: Once your face has been recognized, tap the heart rate sensor to take your picture.

Common

- Timer: Take time-delayed pictures or videos.
- Motion photo: Create a short video by taking pictures.
- Video stabilization: Activate anti-shake.
 Anti-shake helps to keep the focus steady when the camera is moving.
- Grid lines: Display viewfinder grid lines to help composition when selecting subjects.
- Location tags: Attach a GPS location tag to the picture.
- Review pictures: Set to show pictures after taking them.
- Quick launch: Open camera by pressing the Home key twice in quick succession.
- Storage location: Select the memory location for storage. This option only appears if an optional memory card (not included) is installed.

- Voice control: Take pictures by saying "Smile", "Cheese", "Capture", or "Shoot", or record videos by saying "Record Video".
- Volume keys function: Use the Volume key as the camera key, the record key, or for system volume.
- **Shutter sound**: Enable or disable a shutter sound when pictures are taken.
- **Reset settings**: Reset the camera settings.
- **Help**: View information on using the camera.

Live Broadcast

Use YouTube to share what is happening around you.

To access the Live broadcast.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap (III) Apps > (amera.)
- 2. Swipe to the right and tap **Live broadcast**.

Note: You need to sign in to your Google Account and enable live broadcasting in your YouTube settings to use this feature.

- Settings: Set your privacy settings, Video size, Auto save, and manage your account.

- **Stop**: End your Live broadcast.

Record a Live Broadcast

Record and instantly share your videos to YouTube.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap (III) Apps > (amera.
- 2. Swipe to the right and tap Live broadcast.
- Tap a Invite and select contacts to share your Live broadcast with. You also have the option to share your Live broadcast during recording and when you finish recording.
- 4. Press Live to begin recording.
- 5. When you are finished, tap Stop.

Share a Broadcast

You can share your Live broadcast with contacts before recording or share the link after you have finished recording and it has been posted to YouTube.

To invite contacts before broadcasting:

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🔠 Apps > 🍥 Camera.
- 2. Swipe to the right and tap **Live broadcast**.
- 3. Tap a Invite and select contacts or groups to share your Live broadcast with.
- 4. Tap Save to send invites.

To share a Live broadcast while broadcasting:

 Tap Share and select a sharing method to share your Live broadcast.

To share a Live broadcast after broadcasting:

 After recording, tap Share link and select a sharing method to share your Live broadcast.

Live Broadcast Settings

Customize your Live broadcasts.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap ***** Apps > (**) Camera**.
- 2. Swipe to the right and tap Live broadcast.
- 3. Tap Settings and select an option to customize:
 - Account: Tap to add or switch your Google Account.
 - Privacy: Choose either to have your videos unlisted where only friends with a link can view them or public where anyone can view them.
 - Video size: Tap to choose a size option.
 - Social media settings: Share your link with social media when you start broadcasting.
 - Auto save: Tap to enable auto saving your videos to the Gallery app.

- Auto dim: Dims the brightness if you broadcast without touching the screen.
- Add shortcut on Home screen: Tap to create a shortcut to Live broadcast on the Home screen.

Chrome

The Google Chrome app allows you to use the Google Chrome web browser on your device.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Google folder
 Chrome.
- Read the Google Chrome Terms of Service and tap Accept & continue.
- 3. If you have an existing Chrome account, tap **Sign in** to bring your open tabs, bookmarks, and omnibox data from your computer to your phone. Otherwise, tap **No thanks**.
- 4. Use Google Chrome to surf the Internet.

Clock

The Clock app offers features for keeping track of time and setting alarms.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🔠 Apps > 🗹 Clock.
- 2. Tap a tab to use a feature:
 - Alarm: Set an alarm to ring at a specific time.
 - World clock: View the time of day or night in other parts of the world. World clock displays time in hundreds of different cities, within all 24 time zones around the world.
 - Stopwatch: Measure intervals of time.
 - Timer: Use a timer to count down to an event based on a preset time length (hours, minutes, and seconds).

Alarm

Set an alarm to ring at a specific time.

Create an Alarm

Create an alarm event. You can set one-time or recurring alarms, and choose options for how to be notified.

- 2. Tap Add alarm.
- 3. Tap the following items to configure an alarm:
 - **Date**: Choose the day for this alarm.
 - Time: Set a time for the alarm.
 - **Repeat**: Choose when to repeat the alarm.
 - Alarm name: Enter a name for the alarm.
 - **Snooze**: Allow snoozing. Set interval and repeat values for the alarm while snoozing.

- Sound and volume: Choose a sound to play for the alarm, and drag the slider to set the volume of the alarm.
- Vibration: Choose whether the alarm uses vibration alert.
- Increasing volume: Start playing the alarm tone at a low volume at an interval before the alarm time, and slowly increase in volume.
- 4. Tap **Save** to save the alarm.

Delete an Alarm

You can delete an alarm that you created.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap ****** Apps** > **Clock**.
- 2. Find the alarm in the alarm list (under **Alarm**), and then touch and hold it to select it.
- 3. Tap Delete.

World Clock

The World clock lets you keep track of the current time in multiple cities around the globe.

To list a city on the main World clock screen:

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Clock.
- Tap World clock.
- 3. Tap Add city.
- Tap a city to view it on the globe, and tap Add to add it to your list of cities.
- 5. Repeat to add more cities.

To remove a city from the main World clock screen:

- From a Home screen, tap (₩) Apps > (♥) Clock.
- 2. Tap **World clock**.
- Find the city to remove, and then touch and hold it to select it.
- 4. Tap Delete.

Stopwatch

The Stopwatch lets you time events down to a hundredth of a second.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🛗 Apps > 😕 Clock.
- Tap Stopwatch and use the following options:
 - **Start**: Begin timing.
 - Stop: Stop timing.
 - Lap: Keep track of lap times.
 - Resume: Continue timing after stopping the clock.
 - Reset: Reset the Stopwatch to zero.

Timer

The Timer provides a countdown timer for up to 99 hours, 59 minutes, and 59 seconds.

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Clock.
- Tap Timer.
- Use the keypad and tap Hours, Minutes, and Seconds to set the length of the Timer. The following options are available:
 - Start: Begin the Timer.
 - Pause: Pause the Timer.
 - Resume: Resume the Timer.
 - Cancel: Stop the Timer.

Contacts

Store and manage your contacts with the Contacts app, which can be synchronized with a variety of your existing personal accounts.

For more information on connecting with and managing your accounts through your device, see "Accounts" on page 198.

Note: The Contacts app is different from the Contacts tab in the Phone app. Although both list the contacts in your phone and accounts, the available options and functions are different.

Manage Contacts

Access your list of contacts by using the Contacts app. To access your Contacts list:

► From a Home screen, tap **■ Apps** > **○** Contacts.

Find a Contact

You can search for a contact or swipe the list to find one by name.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **△ Contacts**.

Tap a letter on the side of the list to jump directly to that letter in the alphabetical list. You can also slide your finger across the alphabetical list to select a letter with better precision.

Add a Contact

- Tap O Create contact, and then tap contact fields to enter information.
 - Choose a storage account for the contact. You can store the contact on the device or sync it with an account.
 - Tap a Contact photo to assign a picture to the new contact.

 - Tap (+) Add field to enter additional entries.
 - Tap Remove field to remove an entry.
 - Tap More for additional fields.
 - Tap the label to the right of an entry to choose a label for the field (for example, Home or Work).

- Tap Scan business card to import contact information from a business card through the device's camera.
- 3. Tap Save.

Edit a Contact

When editing a contact, you can tap a field and change or delete the information, or you can add more fields to the contact's list of information.

- Tap the contact to select it, and then tap **Details** > **Edit**.
- 3. Tap any of the fields to add, change, or delete information.
- 4. Tap **Save**.

Share a Contact

When you share a contact, the contact's information is sent as a vCard file (VCF) or as a text file. You can share a vCard using Bluetooth or Wi-Fi Direct, attach it to a message, or save it to a storage location.

- From a Home screen, tap (■ Apps > ⚠ Contacts.
- Tap the contact to select it, and then tap **Details** > **Share**.
- Choose whether to send the contact as a vCard file (VCF) or as a Text.
- 4. Choose a sharing method and follow the prompts.

Link Contacts

When you have contacts from various accounts, you may have multiple similar entries for a single contact. Contacts lets you link multiple entries into a single contact.

- 2. Tap the contact to select it, and then tap **Details**.
- Tap More options > Link contacts.
- 4. Tap contacts to choose them.
- 5. Tap **Link**.

Unlink Contacts

You can unlink a contact that you previously linked.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🏢 Apps > 🔼 Contacts.
- 2. Tap the contact to select it, and then tap **Details**.
- 3. Tap More options > Manage linked contacts.
- Tap Disconnect beside contacts to unlink them from the main contact.

Delete Contacts

You can delete a single contact or choose multiple contacts to delete.

- From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > Contacts.
- Touch and hold a contact to select it. You can also tap other contacts or tap the All checkbox at the top of the screen to select all contacts.
- 3. Tap **Delete**, and then confirm when prompted.

Groups

You can use groups to organize your contacts. Your device comes with preloaded groups, and you can create your own. You might create a group for your family, for coworkers, or a team. Groups make it easy to find contacts, and you can send messages to the members of a group.

Create a Group

You can create your own contact groups.

- . From a Home screen, tap 📖 Apps > 🔼 Contacts.
- 2. Tap More options > Groups.
- Tap Create, and then tap fields to enter information about the group:
 - **Group name**: Enter a name for the new group.
 - **Group ringtone**: Customize the sounds for the group.
 - Add member: Select contacts to add to the new group, and then tap Done.
- 4. Tap Save.

Rename a Group

You can rename a contact group.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > COntacts.
- 2. Tap More options > Groups, and then tap a group.
- 3. Tap **Edit** and enter a new name.
- Tap Save.

Add Contacts to a Group

You can add contacts to a group.

- From a Home screen, tap (■) Apps > () Contacts.
- 2. Tap More options > Groups, and then tap a group.
- 3. Tap **Edit** > **Add member**, and then tap the contacts you want to add. When finished, tap **Done**.
- 4. Tap Save.

Send a Message to a Group

You can send a text message to members of a group.

- 2. Tap More options > Groups, and then tap a group.
- 3. Tap More options > Send message.
- 4. Type your message and tap **Send**.

Send an Email to a Group

You can send an email to members of a group.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Contacts.
- 2. Tap More options > Groups, and then tap a group.
- 3. Tap More options > Send email.
- Tap contacts to select them, or tap the All checkbox at the top of the screen to select all, and then tap Done.
 - Only group members that have an email address in their records are displayed.
- 5. Choose an email account and follow the prompts.
- Type your message and tap Send.

Delete a Group

Preset groups cannot be deleted.

- l. From a Home screen, tap **Ⅲ Apps > ⚠ Contacts**.
- Tap More options > Groups, and then tap the group to delete.
- 3. Tap More options > Delete.
- Tap Group only to only delete the group or tap Group and members to delete the group and the contacts in the groups.

Contacts Settings

These settings allow you to modify settings associated with using the Contacts app.

- 2. Tap More options > Settings.
- 3. Tap an option and follow the prompts.

Email

Use the Email app to view and manage all your email accounts in one app.

To access Email:

Configure Email Accounts

You can configure Email for most accounts in just a few steps.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Samsung folder > Email.
- 2. Follow the prompts to set up your email account.

To add an Email account:

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Samsung folder > Email.
- 2. Tap More options > Settings > + Add account.
- 3. Enter your email address and password.

The device communicates with the appropriate server to set up your account and synchronize your email. When complete, your email is displayed in the Inbox for the account.

Note: To configure email account settings at any time, tap *** More options** > **Settings**. Tap the email account to display its settings.

View Multiple Email Accounts

You can view email you receive for multiple accounts on the Combined inbox screen or you can view email accounts individually.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Samsung folder > Email.
- Tap Menu at the top left of the screen to view the current account mailbox.
- 3. Tap the account name to view:
 - Combined inbox: View all email in a combined inbox.
 - [Account Name]: View email for only one email account.

Manage Your Inbox

There are several tools available from the Inbox screen.

- ► From a Home screen, tap **## Apps** > Samsung folder > Email.
 - Tap a message to read and reply or forward it.
 - Tap Search to search for key words in your email inbox.
 - Tap More options for additional message options.

Create and Send an Email

This section describes how to create and send an email using the Email app.

- From a Home screen, tap | Apps > Samsung folder > Email > Compose new email.
- Tap the To field to manually add an email address or tap Add from Contacts to select a recipient from Contacts or Groups.
 - If manually entering recipients, enter additional recipients by separating each entry with a semicolon (;). More recipients can be added at any time before the message is sent.
 - If adding a recipient from your Contacts, tap the contact to place a checkmark, and then tap Done. The contact is displayed in the recipients field.
 - Tap Show additional fields to add Cc and Bcc fields.

- 3. Tap the **Subject** and **Message** fields to enter text.
 - Tap Attach to add Files, Images, Audio, and more to your email.
 - Tap More options for additional email options.
- 4. Review your message and tap **Send**.

Remove Email Accounts

To remove an email account:

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Samsung folder > Email.
- 2. Tap More options > Settings.
- 3. Tap the account you want to remove.
- 4. Tap **Remove**. Confirm when prompted.

Email Settings

These settings allow you to modify settings associated with using the Email app.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Samsung folder > Email.
- 2. Tap More options > Settings.
- Under General, tap an option, and then follow the prompts.
- Tap an account to configure specific settings for only that account.

Gallery

View, edit, and manage pictures and videos.

Note: Some functions described in this section are only available if there are images or videos in the Gallery.

View Images and Videos

Launching Gallery displays available folders. When another app, such as Email, saves an image, a Download folder is automatically created to contain the image. Likewise, capturing a screenshot automatically creates a Screenshots folder.

- From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **★ Gallery**.
- Tap Pictures, Albums, or Stories to change the way images and videos are displayed.
 - In Albums view, you can create albums to organize your images. Tap Albums, and then tap
 More options > Create album.

- Depending on the view mode selected, either tap an image or video to view it, or first tap an album or folder and then tap an image or video.
 - When viewing an image or video, you can swipe left or right to view the next or previous image or video.

Zoom In or Out

Use one of the following methods to zoom in or out on an image:

- Double-tap anywhere on the screen to zoom in or zoom out.
- Spread two fingers apart on any place to zoom in.
 Pinch the screen to zoom out.

Play Videos

You can play videos stored on your device.

- From a Home screen, tap ::: Apps > Gallery.
- 2. Tap a folder or category to open it.
- 3. Tap a video to view it.
- 4. Tap Play video to play the video.

Trim Segments of a Video

You can trim segments of a video.

- Select a video, and then tap the screen once to see the video options.
- 2. Tap **Edit**, and then tap **X Trim**.

- Use the sliders at the bottom of the screen to trim the video. Move the left bracket to the desired starting point, and then move the right bracket to the desired ending point.
- Tap Export to save the video. Modify the File name or Resolution, and then tap Export to confirm the changes.

Edit Images

You can edit images stored on your device.

- While viewing an image, tap the screen once to see the following options:
 - Auto adjust: Apply adjustments determined by built-in correction software.
 - Share: Send the image to your contacts by email, messaging, social media, cloud accounts, or other methods.

 - TII Delete: Delete the image from your device.
 - Favorite: Mark the image as a favorite, and then access it from the Favorites view.
 - More options:
 - Rotate left: Rotate the picture counter-clockwise.
 - Rotate right: Rotate the picture clockwise.

- Details: View and edit information about the image, including the date created, location, and properties.
- Slideshow: Start a slideshow with the images and videos in the current folder.
- Set as contact picture: Set the image as the photo for a contact.
- Set as wallpaper: Set the image as a wallpaper for the Home and Lock screens.
- Print: Send the image to an available printer.

Share Images and Videos

You can share images and videos from your Gallery.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🗯 Apps > 🛖 Gallery.
- 2. Tap a folder to open it.
- In a folder, tap More options > Share, select images and videos, and then tap Share to send them to others or share them with social network services.

- or -

While viewing a single image or video, tap < Share to send it to others or share it with social network services.

Delete Images and Videos

You can delete images stored on your device.

Delete Messages

Messaging icons are displayed at the top of the screen and indicate when messages are received and their type.

Create and Send Messages

- Tap the Recipient field to manually enter a recipient or tap Add from Contacts to select a recipient from your Contacts. You can also select the recipient based on Groups or recent numbers.

 - Enter additional recipients by separating each entry with a semicolon (;) and then using the previous procedure. More recipients can be added at any time before the message is sent.

Before You Start Exercising

This app can be used to monitor your exercise. While moderate physical activity, such as brisk walking, is safe for most people, health experts suggest that you talk with your doctor before you start an exercise program, particularly if you have any of the following conditions:

- Heart disease;
- Asthma or lung disease;
- Diabetes, or liver or kidney disease;
- Arthritis.

You should also check with your doctor if you have symptoms suggestive of heart, lung, or other serious disease, such as:

- Pain or discomfort in your chest, neck, jaw, or arms during physical activity;
- Dizziness or loss of consciousness;

- Shortness of breath with mild exertion or at rest, or when lying down or going to bed;
- Ankle swelling, especially at night;
- A heart murmur or a rapid or pronounced heartbeat;
- Muscle pain when walking upstairs or up a hill that goes away when you rest.

Finally, the American College of Sports Medicine recommends that you see your doctor before engaging in vigorous exercise if two or more of the following apply:

- You are a man older than age 45 or a woman older than age 55;
- You have a family history of heart disease before age 55;
- You smoke or quit smoking in the past six months;
- You have not exercised for three months or more;
- You are overweight or obese;

- You have high blood pressure or high cholesterol;
- You have impaired glucose tolerance, also called prediabetes.

Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi Status Indicators

- If a Wi-Fi access point is available, but your device is not connected to it, Wi-Fi available is displayed.
 It may also display if there is a communication issue with the target wireless Access Point.

Wi-Fi Networks

To scan for a Wi-Fi network and connect to it:

 - Show Wi-Fi pop-up: Receive a pop-up when opening apps if a Wi-Fi network is available.
 - Smart network switch: Connect automatically to a mobile network connection when the Wi-Fi connection is unstable.
 - Wi-Fi notifications: Receive notifications when Wi-Fi networks in range are detected.
 - Hotspot 2.0: Automatically connect to Wi-Fi access points that support Hotspot 2.0.

- Manage networks: Manage your saved Wi-Fi networks.
- WPS push button: Set up a connection to a WPS (Wi-Fi Protected Setup) router or other equipment.
- WPS PIN entry: View the PIN used by your device to set up a PIN-secured connection to a Wi-Fi router or other equipment (not configurable).
- Keep Wi-Fi on during sleep: Specify when to disconnect from Wi-Fi.

Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that connects your device wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as headsets and hands-free car Bluetooth systems, and Bluetooth-enabled computers, printers, and wireless devices.

Note: The Bluetooth communication range is approximately 30 feet.

Turn Bluetooth On or Off

Use the settings menu to turn your device's Bluetooth on or off.

- From a Home screen, tap (■ Apps > ♦ Settings.
- Tap Bluetooth, and then tap On/Off to turn Bluetooth on or off.

Bluetooth Status Indicator

Status baricons indicate your current Bluetooth connection status:

 When Bluetooth is turned on, ** Bluetooth is displayed in the Status bar.

Scan for Bluetooth Devices

When you want to pair with another Bluetooth device, you can scan for nearby devices that are visible.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 📖 Apps > 📀 Settings.
- Tap Bluetooth, and then tap On/Off to turn on Bluetooth.
 - When Bluetooth is first turned on, it scans for nearby Bluetooth devices and displays them.
 - To manually perform a new scan, tap **Scan**.

Pair Bluetooth Devices

The Bluetooth pairing process allows you to establish trusted connections between your device and another Bluetooth device.

Pairing between two Bluetooth devices is a one-time process. Once a pairing is created, the devices continue to recognize their partnership and exchange information without having to re-enter a passcode.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🏢 Apps > 🔯 Settings.
- Tap Bluetooth, and then tap On/Off to turn on Bluetooth.
 - Make sure that the target device is discoverable so that your device can find it. Refer to the instructions that came with the device to find out how to set it to discoverable mode.
- Tap the name of the target device when you see it displayed in the Bluetooth devices section.
 - Your device automatically tries to pair with the target device. If automatic pairing fails, enter the passcode supplied with the target device.

Note: Due to different specifications and features of other Bluetooth-compatible devices, display and operations may be different, and functions such as transfer or exchange may not be possible with all Bluetooth compatible devices.

Rename a Paired Device

Note: You must have a tethering plan on your service account in order to use Mobile hotspot.

Warning: Mobile hotspot consumes battery power and uses data service.

- Tap On/Off to turn Mobile hotspot on or off.

Connect a Device to Your Mobile Hotspot

Use the other device's Wi-Fi control to connect to Mobile hotspot.

- Tap Mobile hotspot and tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn on Mobile hotspot.
- 4. Activate Wi-Fi on the target device.

- 5. Scan for Wi-Fi hotspots and select the target device from the list
- Enter your device's Mobile hotspot password on the target device.

Change the Mobile Hotspot Password

You can change your Mobile hotspot password.

- Tap Mobile hotspot and tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn on Mobile hotspot.

Allowed Devices List

Control whether devices connect to your Mobile hotspot with the Allowed devices list. After you add devices to the list, they can scan for your device and connect using your device's Mobile hotspot name and password.

Note: Using your device as a Mobile hotspot consumes battery power and uses data service. While Mobile hotspot is active, your device's applications use the Mobile hotspot data service. Roaming while using your device as a Mobile hotspot incurs extra data charges.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > Settings.
- Tap Mobile hotspot and tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn on Mobile hotspot.
- Tap More options > Allowed devices, and then tap Add to enter the other device's Device name and MAC address.
- 5. Tap **Add** to add the device.

Configure Mobile Hotspot Settings

Manage your Mobile hotspot security and connecting settings.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap (iii) Apps > 📀 Settings.
- Tap Mobile hotspot and tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- Tap More options > Configure mobile hotspot for the following settings:
 - Network name: View and change the name of your Mobile hotspot.
 - Hide my phone: Enable to make your Mobile hotspot invisible to other Wi-Fi devices during a scan. When enabled, other devices can still connect to your Mobile hotspot, but have to set up the connection manually with your Network SSID and Password.
 - **Security**: Choose the security level for your Mobile hotspot.

- Password: If you choose a security level that uses a password, enter the password. A default password is displayed on the Mobile hotspot screen.
- Show password: Display your password instead of masking it.
- Show advanced options: Access advanced options, including Broadcast channel, and to specify the channel your device uses for Mobile hotspot.

Timeout Settings

Automatically turn off Mobile hotspot if there are no connected devices.

- Tap Mobile hotspot and tethering > Mobile hotspot.
- Tap More options > Timeout settings, and then select an interval.

Tethering Your Device

You can use Bluetooth or USB tethering to share your device's Internet connection with a computer.

- From a Home screen, tap (III) Apps > (Settings.
- Tap Mobile hotspot and tethering, and choose a tethering option:
 - Bluetooth tethering: Use Bluetooth to pair your device with the computer.
 - USB tethering: Connect the computer to the device using the USB cable, and then tap USB tethering to turn on tethering.

Data Usage

Monitor how your data is being used, and set limits and restrictions to conserve it.

Note: Your service provider may account for data usage differently.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap (III) Apps > (Settings.
- 2. Tap Data usage for options:
 - Data usage cycle: Tap the drop-down menu, and then choose a time period for data usage. Data usage for the period is displayed on the graph, along with usage by application at the bottom of the screen.
 - Mobile data: Enable mobile data.
 - Limit mobile data usage: Your mobile data connection is turned off when the specified limit is reached.

- Alert me about data usage: Receive alerts when your device has reached the set warning amount of data usage.
- By application: View data usage by application.
- 3. Tap More options for the following options:
 - Restrict background data: Restrict some apps and services from working unless you are connected to a Wi-Fi network.
 - Show/Hide Wi-Fi usage: Display or hide a Wi-Fi tab that shows Wi-Fi usage.

Advanced Calling

Enjoy high definition voice and video calling from Verizon.

Activate Advanced Calling

To upgrade to Advanced Calling:

- 2. Tap Advanced calling.
 - Tap Activate advanced calling, and follow the prompts to upgrade.
 - Tap Advanced calling, and tap On/Off to enable the feature.

Activate Wi-Fi Calling

S Pen Settings

Configure options and settings for the S Pen.

To configure settings for the S Pen:

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap **S Pen** to configure the following settings:

General

- Air command: Configure the Air command menu. For more information, see <u>"Air Command"</u> on page 37.
- Air view: Turn Air view on or off. Select options for Air view and customize.
- Direct pen input: Turn the Direct pen input feature on or off. This feature allows you to switch from the keyboard to the S Pen when filling in form fields.

 Pointer: Turn the pointer on or off. The pointer appears on the screen when the tip of the S Pen is hovering close enough. Holding the pointer over some features can reveal what an item is or what it does.

Pen detachment

- Detachment options: Choose what should happen when you detach the S Pen. Choose Air command, Create note, or None.

- Cached data: The amount of data currently cached.

4. Tap **Explore** to launch My Files to view content stored on your device.

To increase available memory:

- 1. From a Home screen, tap (iii) Apps > 💽 Settings.
- 2. Tap Storage.
- Tap Internal storage if an optional SD card is installed.
- 4. Tap **Cached data** to clear cached data for all apps.
- 5. Tap **Delete** to confirm.

Memory Card (SD Card)

Once an optional memory card (not included) has been installed in your device, the card memory is displayed as **SD card**.

For more information, see <u>"Install the SIM Card and a</u> Memory Card" on page 4.

Mount a Memory Card

When you install an optional memory card, it is automatically mounted (connected to the device) and prepared for use. However, should you unmount the card without removing it from the device, you need to mount it before it can be accessed.

- l. From a Home screen, tap 📖 Apps > 💽 Settings.
- 2. Tap Storage > SD card.
- 3. Tap Mount.

Format a Memory Card

Warning: When formatting an SD card, you should back up your music and photo files that are stored on the card because formatting the SD card deletes all the stored data.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **# Apps** > **Settings**.
- 2. Tap **Storage** > **SD card**.
- 3. Tap **Format** and follow the prompts.

Remove a Memory Card

Warning: To prevent damage to information stored on the memory card, unmount the card before removing it from the device.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 📖 Apps > 📀 Settings.
- 2. Tap Storage > SD card.
- 3. Tap Unmount.
- Insert the removal tool into the hole on the SIM card/Memory card tray, and push until the tray pops out.
- Remove the memory card from the tray, and slide the tray back into the slot.

Battery

View how battery power is used for device activities.

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Settings.
- Tap Battery for options:
 - Battery usage: View details of battery usage by item.
 - Power saving mode: Extend battery life by selecting a power saving mode level. Choose
 Off, Mid, or Max. Estimated remaining battery life for each mode is provided.
 - App power monitor: Put apps to sleep so that they do not use battery power when not in use.
 Tap Enable to enable.
 - Unmonitored apps: Select apps to exclude from being put to sleep by the App power monitor.

- More options:
 - Notification settings: Configure battery notifications.
 - Advanced settings: Configure advanced battery settings.

Applications Settings

Manage settings for applications on your device.

Application Manager

You can download and install new applications on your device. Use Application manager settings to manage your downloaded and preloaded applications.

Warning: Because this device can be configured with system software not provided by or supported by Google or any other company, you operate this software at your own risk.

Application Manager Options

If you have disabled apps, you can choose whether to display them.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **# Apps > Settings**.
- 2. Tap **Applications** > **Application manager**.
- 3. If you have disabled applications:
 - Tap **Menu** at the top left of the screen.
 - Tap All apps, Enabled, or Disabled.
- 4. Tap More options for the following options:
 - **Memory**: View memory usage information.
 - Show/Hide system apps: Show or hide system (background) apps.

- Draw over other apps: Choose apps that can run on top of other running apps.
- Modify system settings: Select which apps can change system settings.
- Reset app preferences: Reset options that have been changed. Existing app data is not deleted.

Note: Options vary by application.

Manage Apps

You can view and update information about an application, including memory usage, default settings, and permissions.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap (iii) Apps > ② Settings.
- 2. Tap Applications > Application manager.
- Tap an application to view and update information about the application. The following options are displayed:
 - Uninstall/Disable: Uninstall or disable the application. Preloaded apps can only be disabled.

- Force stop: Stop an app that is misbehaving.
 Restart your device if stopping an app, process, or service causes your device to stop working correctly.
- Mobile data: View mobile data usage.
- Battery: View battery usage since the last full charge.
- Storage: Manage the app's storage usage.
- Memory: View memory usage.
- **Notifications**: Configure notifications from the app.
- Permissions: View permissions granted to the app for access to your device's information.
- **Set as default**: Set the app as a default for a certain category of apps.

Default Applications

If you have multiple applications of the same type, such as email apps, you can select one app to be the default.

You can also use a simpler Home screen that provides an easier user experience for first-time smartphone users.

- From a Home screen, tap (Ⅲ) Apps > ♠ Settings.
- 2. Tap Applications > Default applications.
- 3. Tap the following to choose default apps:
 - **Browser app**: Choose a default browser app.
 - Calling app: Choose a default calling app.
 - Messaging app: Choose a default messaging (text and multimedia) app.
 - Default app selection: Choose default apps for other functions.
 - Set as default: Choose default apps for other functions.

- **Home screen**: Choose a Home screen type.
- Phone assistance app: Choose an app that provides assistance for using your device.

Application Settings

Shortcuts to the settings for various apps are available in one convenient location.

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Applications.
- Tap one of the following to display the settings for the selected app:
 - Calendar
 - Camera
 - Contacts
 - Fmail
 - Internet
 - Messages
 - Phone
 - S Voice
 - Weather

NFC and Payment

NFC (Near Field Communication) allows data exchange when you touch your device with another compatible device.

Enable NFC

Activate NFC to allow your device to exchange data with other NFC devices.

- From a Home screen, tap (III) Apps > (Settings.
- 2. Tap **NFC and payment**.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn on NFC.

Android Beam

When Android Beam is activated, you can beam app content to another NFC-capable device by holding the devices close together. You can beam browser pages, YouTube videos, contacts, and more.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🏢 Apps > 🔯 Settings.
- 2. Tap **NFC and payment**.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn on NFC.
- Tap Android Beam, and tap On/Off to turn on Android Beam.
- Touch the back of your device with another NFC-capable device to transfer content, and tap the screen displaying the file you want to share.

Tap and Pay

Tap and pay allows you to select the default payment application you want to use for making purchases on your device.

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap NFC and payment.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn on NFC.
- Tap Tap and pay.
- Tap Payment for the following options:
 - Choose the app that you want as your default.
 - Tap If open app supports Tap and pay to choose whether you want to always use the default payment application, or use an open app if it supports Tap and pay.
- 6. Tap **Others** to choose other types of payment apps.

Location

Some apps, such as Google Maps, may require one or more location services be turned on for full functionality.

Locating Method

Before using any features that require location assistance, you must enable your device's location services.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Location.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn on Location services.
- Tap Locating method to select how your location is determined:
 - High accuracy: Uses GPS, Wi-Fi, and mobile networks.

- Power saving: Uses Wi-Fi and mobile networks (no GPS).
- GPS only: Uses GPS only.
- Tap Improve accuracy to use other connections for determining your location:
 - Wi-Fi scanning: Allow apps and services to scan for Wi-Fi networks automatically, even when Wi-Fi is turned off.
 - Bluetooth scanning: Allow apps to scan for and connect to nearby devices automatically through Bluetooth, even when Bluetooth is turned off.

Recent Location Requests

Apps that have requested your location are listed under Recent location requests.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap ***** Apps > ** Settings**.
- Tap Location.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn on Location services.
- Tap an entry under Recent location requests to view the app's settings.

Location Services

Google Location History™ stores and uses your device's most recent location data. Google apps, such as Google Maps, can use this data to improve your search results based on places that you have visited.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 📖 Apps > 📀 Settings.
- 2. Tap Location.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn on Location services.
- 4. Tap **Google Location History** and sign in to your Google Account for more options.

Lock Screen and Security

Secure your device and protect your data with Lock Screen and Security settings.

Set a Screen Lock

It is recommended that you secure your device using a Screen lock.

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Lock screen and security > Screen lock type to select a screen lock and level of security:
 - Swipe: Swipe the screen to unlock it. This option provides no security.
 - Pattern: Create a pattern that you draw on the screen to unlock your device. This option provides medium security.

- **PIN**: Select a PIN to use for unlocking the screen. This option provides medium to high security.
- **Password**: Create a password for unlocking the screen. This option provides high security.
- None: Do not lock the screen.
- Fingerprints: Use fingerprint recognition to unlock the screen. This option provides medium to high security.
- **Irises**: Use iris recognition to unlock the screen.

- Select your notification preferences, if you choose a secured lock screen option:
 - Tap On/Off to enable or disable showing notifications on the lock screen.
 - Hide content: Enable to hide the content of notifications.
 - Notification icons only: Enable to hide notification details and show only the icon.
- If you also want to use fingerprints or eyes to unlock the device, tap Fingerprints and/or Irises, and then tap Set up. Otherwise, tap Later to skip biometrics setup.
- 5. Choose a screen lock option:
 - Info and app shortcuts: Display a dual clock, owner information, and app shortcuts on the Lock screen.
 - Notifications on lock screen: Show notifications on the Lock screen

 Secure lock settings: Set your secure lock functions such as Secured lock time and Smart lock. This option is not available with Swipe.

Note: Options vary based on the screen lock type.

Fingerprints

Use fingerprint recognition as an alternative to entering passwords in certain apps.

You can also use your fingerprint to verify your identity when logging in to your Samsung account.

Note: Fingerprint recognition uses the unique characteristics of each fingerprint to enhance the security of your device. The likelihood of the fingerprint sensor confusing even small areas of two different fingerprints is very low. But in rare cases, the sensor may recognize a fingerprint that is similar to a registered fingerprint.

Register a Fingerprint

You can register up to three fingerprints. A password is also set up as an alternative to your fingerprint.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 📖 Apps > 📀 Settings.
- 2. Tap Lock screen and security > Fingerprints.
 - If no fingerprints are registered, you are prompted to choose a secure screen lock and scan your fingerprint. Follow the prompts to complete setup.
 - To add a fingerprint, tap (+) Add fingerprint and follow the prompts to register a fingerprint and password. You must set a pattern, PIN, or password to protect your fingerprints.
 - To rename a fingerprint, tap the fingerprint, enter a new name, and then tap Rename.
 - To delete a fingerprint, touch and hold the fingerprint, and then tap Remove. Confirm when prompted.

Fingerprint Verification

Fingerprint verification can be used for other accounts accessed from your device.

- l. From a Home screen, tap 🏢 Apps > 🔯 Settings.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Fingerprints for the following options:
 - **Web sign-in**: Access your online accounts using your fingerprint.
 - Verify Samsung account: Verify your identity using your fingerprint when logging in to your Samsung account.
 - Fingerprint unlock: Tap On/Off to enable or disable fingerprint security.

Irises

Use iris recognition as an alternative to entering passwords in certain apps. You can also use your irises to verify your identity when logging in to your Samsung account.

Warning: Some people may have dizziness, seizures, epileptic seizures or blackouts triggered by light flashes or patterns, even if they have never had a seizure or blackout before. Anyone who has had a seizure, loss of awareness, or other symptom linked to an epileptic condition, or has a family history of such symptoms or conditions, should see a doctor before using the Iris Scanner.

DO NOT stare directly into the infrared iris recognition LED as prolonged use can cause eye strain. Do not stare at the iris recognition LED light when your eyes are less than 20 cm (~8 inches) away from the device, for best results keep your eyes between 25-35 cm (~1014 inches) away for optimum recognition.

Note: The Iris Scanner is not intended to be used as a medical device and the biometric data collected and stored locally by the mechanism is not intended to be used for any diagnostic, therapeutic, or preventative purposes. Please follow all instructions for use of this feature.

For best results, remove eye glasses and sun glasses. Do not use the Iris Scanner in bright sunlight or areas with excessive reflected light (for example, by the pool or seashore). Do not use the Iris Scanner in low light. Look straight at the device (not up, down or sideways), and hold your head still for the scan. Tinted contact lenses and surgically repaired or replaced iris lenses may interfere with operation of the Iris Scanner. Do not walk or operate a vehicle while using the Iris Scanner.

Register Irises

To use your eyes to unlock your device, you must set a pattern, PIN, or password. For best results, perform the set up process indoors, and remove your glasses or contact lenses.

Note: To register just one of your eyes, tap the link on the setup screen to register one iris.

To register your irises:

- 2. Tap Lock screen and security > Irises.
- 3. Follow the prompts to register your irises.

Iris Verification

Iris verification can be used for other accounts accessed from your device.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🏢 Apps > 📀 Settings.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Irises for the following options:
 - **Remove**: Delete existing irises.
 - My irises: Manage your existing irises.
 - Mask on preview screen: Choose a mask to display when using the iris scanner.
 - Web sign-in: Enable to use your irises to sign in to websites.
 - Verify Samsung account: Enable to use your irises to verify your Samsung account when you access a feature or app that requires it.
 - Iris unlock: Enable to unlock the device using your irises.

Unknown Sources

Enable installation of non-Google Play applications.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **# Apps** > **Settings**.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Unknown sources to enable this option.

Warning: Enabling installation of third-party applications can cause your device and personal data to be more vulnerable to attacks by unknown sources.

Secure Folder

Lock your private content and apps to enhance security. You must sign in to your Samsung account in order to use Secure Folder. You must also set a secure lock for your device.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap ***** Apps > ** Settings**.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Secure Folder and follow the prompts to secure content on your device.

Secure Startup

Protect your device by using a screen lock when your device turns on.

Require a numeric PIN or password to decrypt your device each time you power it on.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🎟 Apps > 🔯 Settings.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Secure startup and follow the prompts to encrypt all data on your device.

Encrypt SD Card

Require a numeric PIN or password to decrypt your optional memory card (not included) when you first access it after powering on your device.

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Lock screen and security > Encrypt SD card.
- Tap Encrypt SD card and follow the prompts to encrypt all data on your memory card.

Other Security Settings

SIM Card Lock

Require both your SIM card PIN and your ordinary screen lock type when unlocking the device.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **# Apps** > Settings.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Other security settings > Set up SIM card lock and follow the prompts.
- 3. Tap **Lock SIM card** to enable the feature.
- 4. Tap **Change SIM card PIN** to create a new PIN.

View Passwords

Display password characters briefly as you type them.

- From a Home screen, tap (III) Apps > (Settings.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Other security settings > Make passwords visible to turn the feature on.

Security Update Service

Automatically receive security updates.

- l. From a Home screen, tap 🏢 Apps > 💽 Settings.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Other security settings for the following Security update service options:
 - Security policy updates: Automatically or manually check for security policy updates.
 - Automatic updates can also be limited to only when your device is connected to a Wi-Fi network.
 - Send security reports: Use Wi-Fi to send security reports to Samsung for threat analysis.

Phone Administration

Manage your phone administrators and application installation privileges.

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Settings.
- Tap Lock screen and security > Other security Settings > Phone administrators.
 - Tap Android Device Manager to allow it to lock or erase a lost device.
 - Tap **Support & Protection** to enable it.

Credential Storage

Manage your security certificates. If a certificate authority (CA) certificate gets compromised or for some other reason you do not trust it, you can disable or remove it.

 - Clear credentials: Erase the credential contents from the device and reset the password.

Advanced Security Settings

 - Trust agents: Perform selected actions when trusted devices are connected.

 - Pin windows: Pin an app on your device screen, preventing access to other features of your device.
 - Usage data access: View the applications that can access your device's usage history.

- Notification access: View the applications that can access notifications you receive on your device.
- **Do not disturb permission**: View which apps have permission to change the Do not disturb settings.

Privacy and Emergency

Choose from various modes designed to hide personal content from being accessed by anyone else using your device, or to aid you in an emergency.

Control which apps have permissions to use certain features of your device.

- Tap On/Off next to each app to enable or disable permissions for that feature.

Send SOS Messages

Send a quick alert to your primary contacts when you are in an emergency situation.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > Settings.
- Tap Privacy and emergency > Send SOS messages.
- Tap On/Off to turn the feature on and configure the following options:
 - Send messages to: Add recipients by creating new contacts or selecting from Contacts.
 - Attach pictures: Send pictures to your emergency contacts.
 - Attach audio recording: Send a short audio message to your emergency contacts.

To send an SOS message:

Press the Power key quickly three times.

Emergency Mode

Use Emergency mode to conserve battery power during emergencies. Power-hungry apps and functions are disable, but you are still able to send messages, use Contacts, and make emergency calls.

- 2. Tap Privacy and emergency > Emergency mode.
- 3. Tap **On/Off** to turn the feature on.

Emergency Alerts

This device is designed to receive wireless emergency alerts from the Commercial Mobile Alerting System (CMAS), which may also be known as the Personal Localized Alerting Network (PLAN). For more information, contact your wireless provider.

Emergency alerts allows customers to receive geographically-targeted messages. Alert messages notify customers of imminent threats to their safety within their area. There is no charge for receiving an Emergency alert message.

There are several types of Emergency Alerts:

- Alerts issued by the President
- Alerts involving imminent threats to safety of life (Extreme and Severe)
- AMBER Alerts (missing child alert)
- Emergency alert test messages

Users may choose not to receive Imminent alerts (extreme and severe) and AMBER Alerts.

Note: Alerts issued by the President cannot be disabled.

To disable Imminent and AMBER Alerts:

- From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **♦ Settings**.
- 2. Tap Privacy and emergency > Emergency alerts.
- Tap Settings > Alert types.
 - All alerts are enabled (on) by default.
- 4. Tap an alert option to disable it.

Easy Mode

Switch between the default screen layout and a simpler layout. The Easy mode layout has larger text and icons, making for a more straightforward visual experience.

To enable Easy mode:

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Easy mode.
- 3. Tap **Easy mode** to enable this feature.
 - When Easy mode is enabled, you can swipe down the page and select which apps you want to display on the Home screens.
- 4. Tap the apps you want to add or remove.
- Tap **Done** to save your settings.

To disable Easy mode:

- l. From a Home screen, tap 🔕 Settings.
- 2. Tap **Easy mode** > **Standard mode** to exit Easy mode.
- 3. Tap **Done** to confirm.

Accounts

Set up and manage accounts, including your Google Account, Samsung account, email, and social networking accounts. Depending on the account, you can choose to synchronize your calendar, contacts, and other types of content.

Add an Account

You can add and manage all your email, social networking, and picture and video sharing accounts.

- 2. Tap Accounts > (+) Add account.
- 3. Tap one of the account types.
- 4. Follow the prompts to enter your credentials and set up the account.

Synchronize Accounts

You can synchronize your calendar, contacts, and other types of accounts.

- 2. Tap Accounts > [Account type].
- Tap an account to view the sync settings for that account.
- 4. Tap individual data items to sync.
- Tap More options > Sync now to synchronize the account.

Account Settings

Each account has its own set of settings. In addition, you can configure common settings for all accounts of the same type.

Note: Account settings and available features vary between account types and service providers. Contact your service provider for more information on your account's settings.

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Settings.
- 2. Tap Accounts > [Account type].
- Tap an account to configure that account's sync settings.
- 4. Tap other available options for the account type.

Remove an Account

You can remove accounts from your device.

- From a Home screen, tap Apps > Settings.
- Tap Accounts > [Account type].
- Tap the account and then tap More options Remove account.

Google Settings

Configure your device's Google settings.

Customize Google

To customize your Google settings:

- 1. From a Home screen, tap ****** Apps > *** Settings**.
- 2. Tap **Google**, and select an option to customize:
 - Ads: Configure your Google advertising profile.
 - Location: Configure your Google location settings.
 - Nearby: Use your device's sensors to connect with nearby devices.
 - **Search & Now**: Configure your Google search settings and Google Now settings.

- Security: Configure the Android Device Manager and apps security settings.
- Set up nearby device: Set up another device using Wi-Fi and Bluetooth.

Note: These options may change if you are signed in to your Google Account.

Language and Input

Configure your device's language and input settings.

Language

You can select a default language for your device's menus and keyboards.

Default Keyboard

Samsung Keyboard

Configure options for using the Samsung keyboard.

- Tap Language and input > Samsung keyboard for options:
 - Languages and types: Choose the languages and keyboard types.
 - Predictive text: Predictive text suggests
 words that match your text entries, and can
 automatically complete common words.
 Predictive text can learn your personal writing
 style from your contacts, messages, Gmail, and
 social networking sites improving its accuracy
 of predicting your text entries.
 - Additional keyboard settings provide assistance with capitalization, punctuation, and much more

Google Voice Typing

Speak rather than type your text entries using Google voice typing.

 - Languages: Select languages for Google voice typing.
 - "Ok Google" detection: Launch a Google search whenever you say "OK Google".

 - Offline speech recognition: Download and install speech recognition engines, allowing you to use voice input while not connected to the network.

- Block offensive words: Hide search results that contain offensive words
- Bluetooth headset: Use audio input from a Bluetooth headset (not included) if one is connected

Samsung Voice Input

Select the language to use with Samsung Voice input.

Text-to-Speech Options

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Settings.
- Tap Language and input > Text-to-speech for options:
 - Preferred TTS engine: Choose either the Samsung or Google Text-to-speech engine. Tap
 Settings next to each TTS engine for options.
 - Speech rate: Set the speed at which the text is spoken.
 - Default language status: Display the default language in use.

Pointer Speed

Configure pointer speed for an optional mouse or trackpad (not included).

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **# Apps > Settings**.
- Tap Language and input.
- Under Pointer speed, drag the slider to the right to go faster or to the left to go slower.

Backup and Reset

Back up your data to Google servers. You can also reset your device to its factory defaults.

Smart Switch

Transfer content from your old device to this device.

- From a Home screen, tap (Apps > Settings.
- Tap Backup and reset > Open Smart Switch, and then follow the prompts.

Backup and Restore

Enable backup of your information to Google servers.

- Backup account: Select a Google Account to be used as your backup account.
- Automatic restore: Enable automatic restoration of settings from Google servers.
 When enabled, backed-up settings are restored when you reinstall an application.

Reset

Restore your device to its default settings.

Reset Settings

You can reset your device to its factory default settings, which resets everything except the security, language, and account settings. Personal data is not affected.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap 🎟 Apps > 📀 Settings.
- Tap Backup and reset > Reset settings.
- 3. Tap Reset settings, and confirm when prompted.

Reset Network Settings

You can reset Wi-Fi, Mobile data, and Bluetooth settings with Reset network settings.

- From a Home screen, tap **Apps** > **♦ Settings**.
- 2. Tap Backup and reset > Reset network settings.
- 3. Tap **Reset settings**, and confirm when prompted.

Factory Data Reset

You can reset your device to factory defaults, erasing all data from your device.

This action permanently erases ALL data from the device, including Google or other account settings, system and application data and settings, downloaded applications, as well as your music, photos, videos, and other files. Any data stored on an external SD card is not affected.

Note: When you sign in to a Google Account on your device, Factory Reset Protection is activated. This protects your device in the event it is lost or stolen.

If you reset your device to factory default settings with the Factory Reset Protection (FRP) feature turned on, you must enter the user name and password for a registered Google Account to regain access to the device. You will not be able to access the device without the correct credentials.

Warning: If you reset your Google Account password, you must wait 72 hours after changing your password to perform a factory data reset on your device.

Before resetting your device:

- Verify that the information you want to keep has transferred to your storage area.
- 2. Log in to your Google Account and confirm your user name and password.

To reset your device:

- 2. Tap Backup and reset > Factory data reset.
- Tap Reset phone and follow the prompts to perform the reset.
- 4. When the device restarts, follow the prompts to set up your device.

Date and Time

By default, your device receives date and time information from the wireless network.

When you are outside network coverage, you may want to set date and time information manually using the date and time settings.

- 1. From a Home screen, tap **# Apps > Settings**.
- Tap Date and time. The following options are available:
 - Automatic date and time: Receive date and time updates from the wireless network.
 When Automatic date and time is disabled, the following options are available:
 - Set date: Enter the current date.

- Set time: Enter the current time.
- Select time zone: Choose your local time zone.
- Use 24-hour format: Set the format for displaying time.

Accessibility

Accessibility services are special features that make using the device easier for those with certain physical disabilities.

Note: You can download additional accessibility applications from the Google Play store.

- From a Home screen, tap (III) Apps > (Settings.
- 2. Tap Accessibility for options:

Vision

- Voice Assistant: Give spoken feedback to assist blind and low-vision users.
 - Voice Assistant can collect all of the text you enter, except passwords, including personal data and credit card numbers. It may also log your user interface interactions with the device.
- Voice Assistant help: View help on using Voice Assistant

- Dark screen: Keep the screen turned off at all times for privacy.
- Rapid key input: Release your finger to enter selection instead of double tapping.
- **Speak passwords**: Read the characters aloud as you enter your passwords.
- Text-to-speech: Set your preferred TTS engine and options. For more information, see "Text-to-Speech Options" on page 204.
- Accessibility shortcut: Quickly enable accessibility features in two quick steps.
- **Voice label**: Write voice recordings to NFC tags to provide information about nearby objects.

- Font size: Set the font size.
- High contrast fonts: Adjust the color and outline of fonts to increase the contrast with the background.
- High contrast keyboard: Adjust the size of the Samsung keyboard and change its colors to increase the contrast between the keys and the background.
- Show button shapes: Show buttons with shaded backgrounds to make them stand out.
- Magnifier window: Magnify content shown on the screen.
- Magnification gestures: Use exaggerated gestures such as triple-tapping, double pinching, and dragging two fingers across the screen.
- **Grayscale**: Change all colors to gray.

- Negative colors: Reverse the display of colors from white text on a black background to black text on a white background.
- Color adjustment: Adjust the color of the screen if you are color blind or have difficulty reading the display because of the screen color.

Hearing

- Sound detectors: Give an alert when a crying baby or a doorbell is detected.
- Flash notification: Set your camera light to blink whenever you receive a notification.
- Turn off all sounds: Turn off all notifications and audio for privacy.
- Hearing aids: Improve the sound quality for use with hearing aids.

- Samsung subtitles (CC): Use Samsung subtitles with multimedia files when available.
- Google subtitles (CC): Use Google subtitles with multimedia files when available.
- Left and right sound balance: Use the slider to set the left and right balance when using a stereo device.
- Mono audio: Switch audio from stereo to mono for use with one earphone.

Dexterity and interaction

- Universal switch: Control your device with your customized switches.
- Assistant menu: Improve the device accessibility for users with reduced dexterity.
- Easy screen turn on: Wake up your device by waving your hand over the sensor.
- Touch and hold delay: Select a time interval for this action.

 Interaction control: Block areas of the screen from touch interaction. Disable auto screen rotation and hard key functions. Only show application notifications in the Notification panel and the Status bar.

More settings

- **Direction lock**: Unlock the screen by swiping in a series of four to eight directions.
- Direct access: Open your accessibility settings by pressing the Home key quickly three times in succession.
- Notification reminder: Beep at set intervals to remind you of any unread notifications.
- Answering and ending calls: Select shortcuts for answering and ending calls.
- Single tap mode: Dismiss or snooze alarms, calendar events, and timer alerts, and answer or reject incoming calls with a single tap.
- Manage accessibility: Import and export your accessibility settings, or share them with other devices.

Services

- Support & Protection: Protect your mobile device from threats posed by malicious websites.
- TalkBack: Hear spoken feedback to describe what you touch, select, and activate.
- Switch access: Control your device using configurable key combinations.
